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THE ESTABLISHMENT by Pastor Mark Downey

"Now we beseech you brethren, by the coming of our Lord Jesus the Anointed, and by our gathering together unto him. That ye be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled, neither by spirit, nor by work, nor by letter as from us, as that the day of Anointing is at hand. Let no man deceive you by any means; for that day shall come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition: Who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped: so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, shewing himself that he is God." 2 Thess. 2:1-4

I've been writing about "The Establishment" for decades and decided to dedicate a sermon, not to the Establishment, but to the establishment of Truth. There is a lot of fanfare and talk of the Establishment in this election year 2016. Ever wonder why they call it the Establishment? Do Christians really yearn for the establishment of the Kingdom of God? Who or what is the Establishment in the United States? Well, if we were to synthesize the divine dialectic, the Establishment is not the Kingdom or vice versa. The antithesis of God's Kingdom is often cited as Babylon. The Establishment is a hive of secret societies that have connections to the mystery religions and they want the world. Any Christian worth their salt should know that in prophecy, the Establishment is known as Mystery Babylon.

Well, that was pretty easy to connect those two dots, but what and why is the Establishment doing what they do? Where and when did this Establishment rear its ugly head in America? I'll tell you something: nothing can succeed politically without a spiritual resolve, and by that I don't necessarily mean something good. It can be an evil spirit, a corruption of the soul that becomes the Establishment.

The soul of our nation has become corrupt, because of the Establishment. With the mind we serve the Law of God, but with the flesh we serve the law of sin (Romans 7:25). America has become mindless, for mind control rules the land. The Establishment has raped the mind of its slaves.

If you go to my website (www.kinsmanredeemer.com/) and type in 'establishment' in the search box, you'll find 7 pages and 90% of them are speaking about the religious establishment(s). After 10 years of political activism in the now defunct Populist Party, I had an epiphany that nothing can be accomplished without a spiritual compass. History is replete with governments necessitating a state religion.

A priestcraft would rationalize and/or justify the

actions of its government. The original dialectic was from God in the Garden of Eden between two trees that represented life and death. Adam and Eve ate of the forbidden fruit and were corrupted. The by-product was history or His Story to establish mankind on earth for the Kingdom of God. It didn't get off to a very good start as Adamites lost their racial purity and there was only one family that had maintained the integrity of their generations perfectly (Gen. 6:9). So God established His covenant with Noah.

We read, "*But I will establish My covenant with you, and you shall enter the ark; you and your sons and your wife, and your sons' wives with you*" (Gen. 6:18). This is the first place in the Bible where the two words establish and covenant) are found. It establishes two things: 1. the covenant of providence; that the course of nature shall be continued to the end of time and 2. covenant of grace; that God would be a God to Noah, and that out of his seed God would take to Himself a race of people. This theme is reiterated throughout the Bible, that only one race was earmarked to be a reflection of God's will. When God establishes something, it becomes the establishment of fact. That's the truth and reality.

It was not a temporary deal with Noah alone. For how long then? God said to Abraham, "*I will make you exceedingly fruitful, and I will make nations of you and kings will come forth from you. I will establish My covenant between*

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Me and you and your descendants after you throughout their generations for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and your descendants after you” (Gen. 17:6-7). But, do Jesus and the New Testament make new provisions for the other races? No.

The **exclusiveness** of God choosing Israel cannot include those whom He had no intelligent design to preserve or establish alongside Israel. It would be ambiguous for them to be together in the Kingdom. “Dear brothers and sisters, here’s an example from everyday life. Just as no one can set aside or amend an irrevocable agreement, so it is in this case. **Now to Abraham the promises have been spoken, and to his offspring. It does not say “and to offsprings,” as of many; but as of one: “and to your offspring, which are anointed”** (Gal. 3:15-16. What makes anybody think that what God has set in concrete can be changed?

That is exactly why most **Masoretic Texts** twist this verse: it says singular not plural seeds or races and then in the last phrase mis-translates it by transliterating it by saying “who is Christ” (like the KJV). It deprives the seed of Abraham, the heirs of the promises to the singular individual Jesus, contradicting Scripture. The verse is deracinated by the rabbinic establishment that permeates most judaized seminaries and Bible colleges, thinking Ishmael or the sons of Keturah and Esau or the Edomites could also be heirs; and thus the theology of universalism. Paul just declared that nobody can arbitrarily add to or amend the Word of God and yet that is what the Jew did and does with impunity today, because they establish their authority on the Babylonian talmud, which is a circumvention of divine authority, God’s Law. Our fathers fell asleep at the wheel: silence is implied consent.

So we can safely say that the original establishment or foundation of law was created by God and that it was racial in nature. There would be an enemy that would try to topple it. The instrument of law or covenant with His chosen people continued with Abraham’s son Isaac. Isaac’s sons later become known as Saxons. “Your wife Sarah will bear you a son, and you will call him Isaac. I will establish My covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his descendants after him” (Gen. 17:9).

And then again with Jacob and his sons who would be known collectively as the 12 tribes of Israel: “I will turn to you, make you fruitful and multiply you, and establish My covenant with you” (Lev. 26:9). The Hebrew word for ‘establish’ is quwm (H6965 - koom) and means “to rise.” We would rise “above all other people that are upon the face of the earth” (Deut. 7:6). But, there were stipulations in Lev. 26 as well as Deut 28 that we could fall just as easily as we rise. It depended on who the establishment was.

The very First Commandment prohibited any other establishment or god(s) before, or above or beside our Father in Heaven, because none of them were real. The Law stated that the racial alien shall not rule over thee (Deut 17:15), because that means the alien would have risen to the status of God’s covenant people and what God established would have been usurped with an inferior substitute. How could such a thing happen? Are you getting tired of me constantly referring to Exodus 23:33? “They

shall not dwell in thy land.” No multicultural diversity at all, period! Why? “This people [Israel] will rise up, and go a whoring after the gods of the strangers of the land, whither they go to be among them, and will forsake Me, and break My covenant which I have made with them” (Deut. 31:16).

Leviticus 26 makes it clear that if the nations of Israel did not hearken to the Law and stooped to despising and abhorring the statutes and judgments of God (making their own laws, and not enforcing God’s judgments), then a slew of afflictions would come upon the chosen race of God. For those not up to speed on the establishment of truth: The people we know as Jews today were never descended from Israelites and therefore have no covenant established by God with them. When our White ancestors forsook what God established for them, they received a promise from God; not the blessed types, but the curses:

“I will punish you. I will bring sudden terrors upon you, wasting diseases and burning fevers that will cause your eyes to fail and your life to ebb away. You will plant your crops in vain because your enemies will eat them ... those who hate you shall reign over you ... I will break the pride of your power ... I will send armies against you to carry out the curse of the covenant you have broken ... And I will scatter you among the heathen, and will unsheathe the sword after you, and your land shall be a desolation, and your cities shall be a waste” (verses 16-33).

If you don’t want the original establishment from God, this is what you can expect: another establishment that is not friendly to you or your kind at all. Another establishment is alluded to in the New Testament as “another gospel” and “another Christ.” The religious establishment has brought forth an apostate church that supports the rise of usury and the love of money.

However, if we confess our iniquities and that of our fathers i.e. the trespass against our God, in which we walk contrary to our God

and as a consequence mix with the racial aliens, then a solution presents itself to the nation-race. Here it is: If we humbled ourselves and accepted the punishments we deserved, rather than trying to vote our way out of it for yet another version of Babylon’s establishment, then vs 42 of Lev. 26 promises, “Then will I remember My covenant with Jacob, and also My covenant with Isaac, and also MY covenant with Abraham will I remember; and I will remember the land.”

Then we can remember what our God established in the beginning. Then we will have the eyes to see the life that the judaized religious establishment has stolen from us; to see the church of rigor mortis and the governments of wickedness high places. There is no more separation of church and state than there is opposition to the Establishment without Jesus. That’s how far down the slippery slope we’ve gone.

Remember the Borg? They were part organic and part android and would assimilate everyone they came into contact with, transformed into the mass mind, erasing any memory of their old life. When they first communicated with the Enterprise, the cold mechanical voice said, “We are the Borg. Lower your shields and surrender your ships. We will add your

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biological and technological distinctiveness to our own. Your culture will adapt to service us. Resistance is futile."

How ironic that today's Establishment has the same initiative to absorb all the peoples, religions, governments and economies of the world into one. They say history repeats itself. Case in point, the Tower of Babel triggered a divine intervention. I believe God is not mocked and we can expect a repeat performance to confound the mixed multitudes. Only those who know in their hearts that it's time to get racist will understand the signs.

By and large, in this Orwellian world, nobody is opposed to the Establishment other than Christian Identity, because we see the wickedness of government supported by judeo-Christians. Some people may consider themselves anti-establishment, but it's for the wrong reasons. We are against the Establishment for the same elements in today's reading in 2 Thessalonians i.e. those who oppose and exalt themselves above any deity or object of worship; that is the only way the Establishment can rise above the one true Creator God of the universe. ... to be the absolute adversary of God Almighty. It's a racial reality that has blinded Israel "in part." An enemy has planted the seeds of mongrelization.

Just as the Kingdom is constituted of four elements, namely, land, people, law and a king, so too is the Establishment of man, with the vicarious proviso of acquisition of land, subjugation of people, imposition of law and the deification of man. Quite a contrast don't you think? That's why God's Kingdom and rule is likened to a wooden yoke, whereas the yoke of beast empires is made of iron (Jer. 28:13). This is what Jesus said, "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matt. 11:29). The Lord could have just as easily said, 'take My establishment.' Why do Christians forget that the Creator of land said "The land shall not be sold forever: for the land is Mine; and you are only foreigners and temporary residents on My land" (Lev. 25:23). Nobody, not one family dynasty, nor any Establishment of man or racial alien in history has ever owned the land in perpetuity.

All the great civilizations have failed, because of miscegenation more than anything else. Does this not establish God as the owner of His own Creation? Ancient Israel was given a chance to establish the Kingdom in the Promised Land, but they were given the command to eradicate the occupants of the land, the Canaanites. They failed to obey God. The adversaries of God, on the other hand, want the amalgamation of all human beings to reside on earth without any borders with a one world government void of Jesus the Anointed; the Establishment of homogenization and mongrelization of religion and economics i.e. Mystery babylon. It takes the village idiot to raise the children of the future.

All covenant blessings are summed up in the covenant relationship: "I will be your God, and ye shall be My people" (Lev. 26:12); and they are all grounded upon their redemption. Having purchased them, God would own them, and never cast them off till they cast Him off. In my

last message 'A Judicial Conundrum,' we indeed saw how our ancestors rejected the system of judges that God established for them as their established form of government.

They cast off God's way (Law) and whored after strange gods (other law systems), wanting to be like other non-Israelite nations. They went with the iron yoke (a captivity whereby they were removed from their own land - a wooden yoke was to be oppressed but still in their own land) and it was a heavy price to pay for greater burdens. It begs the question: how could they be so stupid? The answer is found in the same chapter as today's Scripture reading, 2 Thes. 2:9-11, speaking of the satanic adversary, which can only be found in jews, the lineal descendants of Esau-Edom, "*The people against whom the Lord hath indignation forever*" (Mal. 1:4)—the Establishment that is usurping God's authority, a religion that sanctions the nullification of all vows and oaths for the coming year (the **kol nidre**) i.e. bearing false witness. Here's what it says, starting in verse 9, "*Whose presence is in accordance with the operation of the adversary in all power and signs and wonders of falsehood, and in every trick of unrighteousness in those who are perishing, because they accepted not the love of the truth, for them to be preserved.*"

Can you imagine an entire breed of antichrists (jews) whose sole modus operandi is the dark world of PSYOPS (psychological operations employed in warfare) and it is the White Christians who are "accounted as sheep for the slaughter" (Romans 8:36). White people really can't fathom the extent to which jews make the Big Lie a talmudic life-style. And here's the kicker: "Because of this, God will send them a powerful delusion, so that they will believe what is false." Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me" John 14:6.

Christians should know that the Establishment is not the way to go and yet millions of our people are led into the slaughterhouse. It's not the way of Jesus, but that's what we've done. An entire nation was led into a fratricidal war based on lies, with brothers killing brothers so that the jew could get rich and powerful. Or an Establishment that can give a wink and subsidize the abomination of Planned Parenthood, a non-profit for profit organization that admittedly harvests and sells baby parts from aborted fetuses.

The Nuclear family is the foundation for God's chosen people. An entire generation has been fooled that raising a family isn't worth it. Amos 3:2 reads, "*You only have I known (chosen) among all the families of the earth.*" No families - no chosen people. Instead, the traditional family is "blended" or contaminated with mongrels; same-sex marriages produce no children; and adopted non-Whites into White families exacerbate the maintenance of racial purity. To even utter the words 'racial purity' is the bane of political correctness. A society that encourages or forces our young couples to avoid marriage and child-rearing is the self-indulgence of hedonism. A young man may forgo the trials and tribulations of raising a family, but he also forfeits the joys and love of family and propagating our race.

The institution of marriage is being dismantled by the

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Establishment. How many politicians dared to follow Jesus last year when they could have stood up for a county clerk right here in Kentucky, **Kim Davis**, who refused to sign a license for sodomites to marry?

In past presidential elections, family was a big issue, but no longer. Only an enemy would create a hostile environment for strong families in the Lord, stout disciplined fathers creating well-adjusted and healthy children and motherhood as the pinnacle of a woman's life. Without monogamy enforced by a Christian theocracy, society will be reduced to the level of animals and baser instincts. The White race was created by God to rise above the animal, which is why we are the only creatures on earth to quench that Spirit.

How can our society be so vulnerable to these con artists turned social engineers who celebrate dumb candidates and dumber voters? How? It is several generations raised on television and never having an original thought of their own. It is taking the pulpit pounder's word as gospel, rather than taking the gospel as the Word of God. It is having no other valuation of things other than materialism. It is sentencing our children to twelve years of Marxist indoctrination, schooling their minds into politically correct mush.

We can only sink to the bottom with the other bottom feeders, because we denied our God-given destiny predicated on spiritual values. Men and brethren, what shall we do? Before I leave this high office, I intend to expose this plot." John F. Kennedy said that seven days before his assassination. The Game takes no prisoners. The rules of the Game are superficial. Too bad he wasn't a Christian, knowing how the Game is played. As more and more of our people bow out of their Game and bow before Jesus, we will rise to our manifest destiny. God will protect us against the Establishment. They might kill us. But, "*Do not fear those that kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him*

who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell" (Matt. 10:28). Their Game has no effect on our salvation "*If God is for us, who can be against us?*" Romans 8:31. Our destiny is unstoppable and inevitable. The elections of man are transient and fleeting.

This is a message for those who fight the Establishment of devils. As peaceful as your protest may be, it threatens the Establishment and those in charge of it. To think they will just roll over and hand the empire to you is stupidity. They are going to fight. They are going to lie. They are going to do anything in their power to keep the Establishment the way it is. I think it is important to remember that anything they do to you is nothing compared to what they do to us all and have done to us in the past. And if not stopped, will continue to do to us in the future. So when they fight you, and they will, keep in mind that it is a sure sign that what you are fighting for ... is working.

Donald Trump is the designated hitter in the Game for student body president, because it doesn't rise above the animal level of donkey and elephant and doesn't even come close to the stature of the government of Christ. He is the star of the show, because the Establishment knows what the people want to hear. How do they know? They're the ones who have a better understanding of biblical cause and effect than we do. They can imitate the principles of dialectics that God originated, and thus play God in their Game of enmity or opposition. They can even pretend to be the opposition party, a controlled opposition: during Reconstruction, northern newspapers hired thugs to commit atrocities in the name of the KKK; today, the CIA and Mossad pretend to be opposed to ISIS, when, in fact, they created and manipulate ISIS. (Israeli Secret Intelligence Service?).

I contend that the Establishment pretends to be opposed to Trump, when in fact, everything indicates a sloppy charade as flimsy as the inside job of 9/11. Anybody who has studied the JFK assassination, knows that all of the discrepancies of the Warren Commission belied the 'lone nut theory.' Likewise, the 9/11 Commission was a sham creating more questions than answers. I think history will demonstrate that the 2016 election was an elegantly staged dialectic to establish the Establishment for the next generation of deracinated tax slaves.

The pundits say Trump is tapping into the anger of Americans. If they're angry about their shrinking wallets, their priorities are not right. What's in your wallet? What's in Trump's wallet? Ten billion dollars? What's he got to be angry about? **Rich people** are never held accountable for their ill-gotten wealth. That is, until recently, because Babylon is falling. A debt-usury system can only last for so long before it implodes. Babylon is desperate that that's why the antics of this election year are so weird. Out of a population of 250 million people, there's a crop of candidates that shouldn't even be elected dog catcher.

Our own people provoke God to anger and all we get is this lousy actor who pretends to be angry, feeding off angry voters ... or shall we say tax slaves? It's pure political theater if you have the eyes to see it and a bag of popcorn. There are so many things wrong about Trump and yet he

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hits a nerve that resonates with those who know something is terribly wrong with America. How long he can maintain this charade is anybody's guess, but he is aided and abetted by the media. It doesn't matter whether it's good press or bad, he's soaking up attention like a sponge. It would be quite easy to be caught in the currents of the Trump riptide if for no other reason than to flip the bird to the Establishment. However, there is a disturbing affection of some Identity Christians (it's more like an affliction) who are acting like secular White Nationalists and David Duke clones, that should know better.

Trump is not a loose cannon, but a big gun, big enough to throw the election much more elegantly than Ross Perot. Please tell me what's the difference between the Democratic Party's foreign policy establishment and the GOP's neocon establishment? What if I told you that the left wing and the right wing belong to the same turkey? That liberals as well as conservatives, for fear of the jews, serve the same master. Both are firmly entrenched in what 'Ike the kike' warned about: a military industrial complex, that he didn't finish explaining, which is perpetual wars for the kingdom of IsraelIE's global economy.

When Trump first began his carefully crafted tirades, which launched his bid for the GOP nomination, he said, reading from a script, "Donald J. Trump is calling for a total and complete shutdown of Muslims entering the United States until our country's representatives can figure out what the hell is going on." I can tell you what's going on. Then everywhere, the citizens, obliged to defend themselves against the world minority of revolutionaries, will exterminate those destroyers of civilization, and the multitude, disillusioned with Christianity, whose deistic spirits will from that moment be without compass or direction ... will receive the true light through the universal manifestation of the pure doctrine of Lucifer, brought finally out in the public view. This manifestation will result from the general reactionary movement which will follow the destruction of Christianity and atheism, both conquered and exterminated as the same time."

Now I'm not too much of a boy crying wolf or Illuminati, because wolves and secret societies have a tendency to disguise themselves; they are terrific actors on the world stage; but the ancient thespians were commonly understood

to simply be entertaining liars. Is there anything new under the sun? Some people say Pike's words were a fake, but regardless, somebody has taken them to heart and put them into play.

The notorious Protocols have also been denied as forgeries and yet the strategies have been implemented and have come to pass. God is in control and allowing them to think they are some kind of almighty Establishment, but if Christian Identity has anything to do about it, it is to identify the Truth and set our people free from the illusions and make-believe world of politics. As I was working on this message, Friday evening erupted in a perfect storm of Marxist dialectics at the Trump rally in Chicago. I haven't read his book, but I doubt that he even gave God lip service.

HOW DO DOCTORS DIE?

Dr. Ed Friedlander is a clean-cut, 64-year-old pathologist practicing in Kansas City, Missouri. He does not look like a person who would have a tattoo. But square in the center of his chest, in bold ink, are these words: "No CPR."

The tattoo isn't a fashion accessory. It is there to reinforce what Dr. Friedlander has written in his living will: In the event of many medical emergencies, he does not want to be given cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or other life-prolonging procedures. Even if he is unconscious and the paramedic doesn't know about the will, he can just read the tattoo.

It's not that Friedlander doesn't enjoy being alive. But his career in medicine has given him more knowledge than the average person about the realities of CPR and other emergency procedures. And all that knowledge has left him with little faith in those procedures. "In pathology, you think a lot about the end of life," he said. "Nobody would ever accuse me of not loving life. ... (But) when this thing stops beating, it's time for me to move on." Friedlander says he never wants to receive what some doctors call "futile care."

Dr. Ken Murray had a private practice of general medicine in Studio City, California, for 25 years until his retire-

ment in 2006. In his 2011 online article, "how Doctors Die," he defines "futile care" as what happens "when doctors bring the cutting edge of technology to bear on a grievously ill person near the end of life." Murray says, "The patient will get cut open, perforated with tubes, hooked up to machines, and assaulted with drugs. All of this occurs in the Intensive Care Unit at a cost of tens of thousands of dollars a day. What it buys is misery ..."

Friedlander and Murray are not the only medical experts with a low opinion of these kind of "futile care," end-of-life treatments.

Doctors Opt Out

The average person frequently elects to receive all kinds of "futile care" for himself and even more so for a loved one. Finding himself in an emergency room after a crisis has struck, he is frightened and overwhelmed. If doctors ask if he would like "everything available" to be done, he is prone to say yes.

"Then," Murray says, "the nightmare begins."

Sometimes, a family really means 'do everything,' but often they just mean 'do everything that's reasonable.' The trouble is that people who are not medical experts usually don't know what is reasonable in a given scenario and what is not. And doctors who are asked to do "everything available" generally do it - even when it is not reasonable.

Murray explains that part of the problem is the "unrealistic expectations the general population has about what doctors can accomplish."

But many doctors themselves do not have any such "unrealistic expectations" about the

capability of the medical establishment. As part of the ongoing John Hopkins Precursors Study, 765 doctors (with mean age of 68) responded to a 1998 questionnaire asking what they would want done for themselves if they were suffering from irreversible brain damage or brain disease where they couldn't recognize people or speak understandably, but did not have terminal illness.

The doctors were asked if they would want to receive the following procedures; CPR, mechanical ventilation, dialysis, chemotherapy, major surgery, invasive testing, nourishment from a feeding tube, blood transfusion, antibiotics and intravenous hydration.

Ninety percent of the doctors said if they were in such a grim end-of-life situation, they would not want CPR. About 87 percent said they would refuse mechanical ventilation, and the same number said they would refuse dialysis. Eighty-five percent said no to chemotherapy, and 81 percent opted out of all major surgery. About 79 percent said they would not want invasive testing, and 77 percent said no to being fed via a feeding tube. Seventy-four percent said they would not want blood transfusions. About 62 percent said no to antibiotics and 59 percent said no even to intravenous hydration.

Those are some astounding numbers. Over the course of their careers, doctors have witnessed patients undergoing these very same procedure numerous times. Why don't they want these methods used on themselves?

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The more courageous men become, the better able they are at talking about the hard stuff.

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It's not *in spite* of the fact that they have experience with these procedures - it's *because* of it. The realities of these common medical practices have disillusioned the doctors.

Dr. Murray explains: "Doctors ... know enough about modern medicine to know its limits ... For all the time they spend fending off the deaths of others, they tend to be fairly serene when faced with death themselves. They know exactly what is going to happen, they know the choices, and they generally have access to any sort of medical care they could want. But they go gently."

Dr. Saul Blecker, assistant professor of population health and medicine of NYU Langone Medical Center, agrees with that logic: "Doctors see a lot of patients who are treated aggressively at the end of life, and often in ways that seem maybe too intense." Blecker says if more people had understanding of the limitations of end-of-life care, "more people" would choose to "die a 'good death.'"

If those who know the most about modern medicine have a bleak view of end-of-life treatments, why does the general population tend to see it differently?

'I'm Not a Doctor, but I Play One on TV'

Part of the reason why the general population puts more trust in medical procedures than doctors do stems from how they are portrayed in the media.

Back in 1996, researchers from the Durham VA Medical Center examined the TV programs *ER*, *Chicago Hope* and *Rescue 911* to see how many people on the shows benefited from CPR intervention. The conclusion was that 77 percent of patients were revived by CPR and were basically all better.

In real life, the number is a fraction of that. Overall survival rates are rarely compiled since researchers focus on specific demographic groups. Only 2 percent of adults of all ages who receive CPR after collapsing out-of-hospital fully recover, according to a 2012 study published in the *Journal of the American Medical Association*. Of the 15,300 Swedes of all ages who suffered cardiac arrest outside of hospitals from 1990 to 2011, just 10.5 percent were alive 30 days later. A 2009 study in the *New England Journal of Medicine* said that about 18 percent of seniors who receive CPR in a hospital survive to be discharged. And of those who do survive to discharge, fewer than half have a full recovery free of lasting complications.

While TV says almost 8 in 10 CPR patients spring back to good health and return to their lives, the reality is it is much lower.

Doctors know this reality far better than the rest of us. That is why 90 percent of them say that in an en-of-life scenario, they would not want CPR. Not only is it unlikely to help, but it generally breaks the patients' ribs, filling the last chapter of their lives with a great deal of pain.

But CPR is mild compared to some other end-of-life procedures.

Torturous Treatment

"I think a lot of times, we're doing things to people that we wouldn't do to a terrorist," Murray said.

One such procedure is intentionally paralyzing patient so they can be attached to a breathing machine. Unless they are paralyzed, their bodies involuntarily fight against the rhythm of the machine. Dr. Murray explains: "So what happens is you have a person that is fighting, fighting, fighting,

and you can't get air in and out of them, so you paralyze them. But it doesn't mean they're asleep. They're not asleep. They are completely helpless, and yet they are aware of everything that's going on around them."

Doctors see how agonizing this induced paralysis is for patients. That is why 87 percent of them say that if their brains were damaged, they would not want to be put on mechanical ventilation.

Not the Only Life

The problem is sometimes less about people having too much faith in end-of-life procedures than it is about patients and doctors alike being caught in a medical system that encourages excessive treatments. In either case, many patients receive treatments that accomplish little.

Dr. Murray draws on his own background in medicine to summarize his powerful point: "It's not a frequent topic of discussion, but doctors die, too. And they don't die like the rest of us. What's unusual about them is not how much treatment they get compared to most people, but how little. —If there is a state-of-the-art of end-of-life care, it is this: death with dignity. As for me, my physician has my choices. They were easy to make, as they are for most physicians. There will be no heroics, and I will go gentle into that good night—like my fellow doctors."

The Bible says "*It is appointed*" that all people will die (Hebrews 9:27). We don't have to fear that inevitability. And we don't have to fill our final weeks or months with invasive, expensive and futile treatments, clinging to this life as if it is the only one here. God makes clear that the richness of what comes next eclipses this life by many orders of magnitude: "*Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love Him*"

(1 Cor. 2:9).

God also said, through the Apostle Paul, that "the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18). That future existence will be *so astounding* that, for the most part, this current life will not even "be remembered" (Isaiah 65:17).

If we reject the unrealistic expectations the media have given us about what doctors can accomplish, and if we learn from the experiences of the growing number of doctors like Friedlander, Murray and Blecker who don't have faith in "futile care" and-of-life procedures, then, when the time comes to opt out of certain procedures—even to accept death as they aim to: with gentle dignity.

CREMATION OR BURIAL

The Sanctity of the Body

"*What? Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's*" (1 Cor. 6:19-20). By right of creation God possesses the ownership of the body which is the temple of the Holy Spirit. "*Know ye not that ye are the temple of God,*



and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are" (1 Cor. 3:16-17).

Burial is a testimony of a belief in a future resurrection. "For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth: and though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God." (Job 19:25-27). Job's body was buried and destroyed by worms, not consumed by fire. Cremation is not a Christian practice in that it dishonours the temple of God in reducing it to ashes. When the body is buried, it returns back to the dust according to the laws of nature as an act of God. Cremation is an act of man by a decision based on convenience and financial expediency of the moment.

A Christian burial is one's silent testimony of the assurance of a bodily resurrection at the time of our Lord's return. "Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice, and shall come forth;" (John 5:28-29). Matthew records: "the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints which slept arose, and came out of the graves after his resurrection, and went into the holy city, and appeared unto many" (Matt. 27:52-53).

The Lord has reserved destruction by fire as a sign of His contempt for the abominable idols of the heathen. "The graven images of their gods shall ye burn with fire" (Deut. 7:25). "Thus saith the LORD, Learn not the way of the heathen" (Jer. 10:2).

As our western society becomes less Christian and more secular in its traditional values, cremation or burial is now a major issue. Even among some Christians, their decision reveals a lack of sanctity for the human body and an ignorance of Scripture. The influences of paganism have now invaded Western Christian thought and Christianity is now playing a lesser role within the confines of the modern church.

Greek and Roman cultures practiced cremation due to their paganized minimal value of the body and priority on the immortality of the soul. Abortion and cremation show a complete disrespect for the physical creation of God. Burning of bodies was conducted by the Canaanites in worship of their idols, Molech and Chemosh. God forbid this practice among the Israelites and listed it with witchcraft. "When thou art come into the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee, thou shalt not learn to do after the abominations of those nations. There shall not be found among you any one that maketh his son or daughter to pass through the fire." (Deut. 18:9-12).

The burning of Achan's body was a curse for his sin. "And it shall be, that he that is taken with the accursed thing shall be burnt with fire, he and all that he hath: because he hath transgressed the covenant of the LORD, and because he hath wrought folly in Israel" (Joshua 7:15). Denial of a burial was a sign of dishonour and contempt such as King Jehoiakim, Ahab and Jezebel (1 Kings 21:17-24; Jer. 22:19). The King of Moab was condemned for burning the bones of the King of Edom (Amos 2:1). Annihilating fire is a sign of divine judgment reserved for use by

God Himself (2 Thess. 1:7-8) and proven in the fiery destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah for their wickedness (Gen. 19:1-29).

5 Modern Reasons for Cremation

- 1) Convenience for the remaining family members.
- 2) Acquiescence to a professional advisor.
- 3) Sanitation in an ecological conscious society.
- 4) Economic affordability in avoiding excessive expenses.
5. Available space where cemetery plots are at a critical premium.

Biblical Examples

The Hebrew/Israelite method of handling the dead was burial. This honored the deceased and showed respect to the physical body as a creation of God. At Sarah's death, Abraham purchased a cave as a burying ground for his family (Gen. 23:1-20). Abraham was buried in that family cemetery (Gen. 25:5-10). Jacob charged his sons to bury him in the same cave so that he would rest with those he loved (Gen. 49:28-32). Jacob's sons carried him into the land of Canaan, and buried him in the cave of the field of Machpelah," (Gen 50:13).

Burial is the last physical connection with one's beloved relative. It is the last act of affection towards those with whom you lived and loved while in health enjoying the happy days gone by. Cremation denies this connection both with ancestors and descendants. When Rachel died "Jacob set a pillar upon her grave: that is the pillar of Rachel's grave unto this day" (Gen. 35:20). That pillar was a memorial for generations to remember her. Where is a memorial marker over the scattered ashes of the cremated? "Rebekah's nurse died, and she was buried beneath Bethel under an oak:" (Gen 35:8) which means "the oak of weeping." A burial allows a time and place where the deceased's family can gather to say goodbye to their departed loved one and return to pay respect. Cremation denies the family this privilege.

Joseph was embalmed, placed in a coffin and later buried (Gen. 50:24-26; Josh. 24:32). Miriam, the sister of Moses was buried (Num. 20:1). The Lord Himself buried Moses (Deut 34:5-6). Joshua was buried in the land of his inheritance (Josh. 24:29-30). Samuel was buried in his hometown (1 Sam. 25:1). "Devout men carried Stephen to his burial and made great lamentation over him" (Acts 8:2). Cremation was not an option in these cases. Jesus' body was buried. "He made his grave with the wicked" (Isa. 58:9). "This man [Joseph of Arimathea] went unto Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. And he took it down, and wrapped it in linen, and laid it in a sepulchre that was hewn in stone, wherein never man before was laid" (Luke 23:52-53).

As part of the curse placed upon Adamic man, God declared: "In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art; and unto dust shalt thou return" (Gen. 3:19).

TITHING

WHERE IS YOUR TREASURE?

Discover how tithing is an act of worship from which god learns much about our hearts and our treasure.

When my wife and I most recently moved, we had to go through the process of applying for a new mortgage. I had to turn over every last detail about my financial situation. They wanted to know deposits, where the money came from, where my money was going. I had to turn over details of all of my bank accounts. They learned a lot about me—and so did I. Looking at someone's finances tells you a great deal about their values. Jesus the Anointed said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). What does God know about your heart, about your values and what you hold dear? How dear is your money to you?

Let's consider a biblical practice that tells us something about the most important relationship that we have in life. We're going to look at *tithing*—and what it tells us about how we view our relationship with God.

Why Should Christians Tithe?

I learned about tithing when I was a young man. I've tithed virtually all my adult life. At times, particularly when teaching tithing principles to others, I've had to ask myself all over again: Why do I tithe? Why is it that I go through this regimen, this process, this part of my relationship with God regarding tithing? Every time I come back to the question, the answer comes down to several reasons that I'd like to share with you. It has to do with much more than just money.

Let's first define what we mean by tithing. The word *tithe* comes from an old English word that means 10 percent or a tenth. A *tithe* is 10 percent of one's income, and when the Bible talks about tithing it refers to setting one tenth of your *increase* aside for God. Let me share the question I've had to ask myself again: Why do I tithe? Why do I set 10 percent of my income to give to God?

I tithe because that is what the Bible shows we are to do. We first see it in the example of a man named Abraham, a man called the father of the faithful and "the friend of God" (Romans 4:11, 16; James 2:23). I believe that his example sets the tone for a fundamental approach that Christians should have toward this aspect of God's Law and God's Work in our lives in bringing us into a relationship with Him.

An Ancient Example of Faith

The story of tithing begins near the beginning of Scripture, in the book of Genesis. At one point in his life, we read of Abraham saddling up his troops and going off to rescue and bring home his nephew Lot,

who had been taken prisoner by regional warlords. In addition to rescuing Lot, Abraham also won much treasure as the spoils of battle. At this point in the story another figure enters the scene:

"Then Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was the priest of God Most High" (Gen. 14:18). This mysterious individual then pronounced a blessing on Abraham. And Abraham did this: "He gave him a tithe of all" (vs 20).

This is a very compacted version of an interesting story, but these facts point to several lessons for us to learn in regard to tithing as it is introduced into the flow of the Bible through the example of Abraham giving a tithe to Melchizedek. Right here we begin to see the character of Abraham—a man later called the father of the faithful.

This is really the story of Abraham's character and obedience. Abraham gave a tithe—10 percent of his gain—as an act of worship. It can be hard for modern mind to think about giving 10 percent of income as an act of worship, but that's exactly what it is.

In this act of worship, God learns something about us. When we order our financial affairs and our heart around the treasure of our lives and get God in the right perspective and priority, God truly learns where our heart is. Many will give lip-service to God while vehemently holding on to their finances, showing that their heart is far from Him.

Another purpose God has for tithing is to support the work He is doing here on earth. God has a practical side. He has not left the most important work on earth, the preaching of the gospel of the Kingdom of God, without a means to be financed.



This is also something I learned very early in life. My mother taught me about tithing, and she taught me to put aside a small portion, 10 percent out of the allowance that I would get. And when I began getting a small check for the jobs and chores that I would do, I put a tithe of that money aside as well. I learned where that tithe was to go, in terms of supporting the work of God. It's a very practical lesson with great spiritual consequences.

Tithing represents a Christian way of giving to God what is rightfully already His. It is to be used for the support of the most important work on the face of the earth. Tithing has always been part of God's plan for people. We see it within the various Laws given in the Bible. Leviticus 27:30 says: "*All the tithe of the land, whether of the seed of the land or of the fruit of the tree, is the LORD's. It is holy to the LORD.*"

God says that the first 10 percent of increase is holy to Him. When you think of what you earn in those terms, it begins to redefine how you look at physical things.

Tithing Helps Us Remember to Put God First

In Numbers 18:21 we learn that God apportioned the tithe to the Levites because they had the responsibility of doing the work of God within the temple. Today, God's command to tithe is really a means by which Jesus the Anointed does His work through the spiritual body of the Church. The Church has a divine commission to preach the gospel of the Kingdom of God (Matthew 28:18-20).

I've learned that it is folly to abandon this true way of God and to try to substitute another way. Tithing helps us to develop good habits of stewardship and selflessness. Tithing helps us understand God's blessings in our lives and become better stewards of what He's given us by developing patience and wisdom in how we use our money. Tithing helps us prioritize properly by the fact that we automatically put God first. Tithing is an essential part of developing a godly ethic towards money and our physical blessings. I've come to understand that this ethic of faithfulness and good stewardship is really the most important lesson of God's Law of tithing.

As we watch what is taking place in our world today, with one crisis after another, the value of faithfulness and stewardship should be obvious. In the United States we see an economic crisis that began in 2008 partly due to a lack of these two virtues in society. A lack of these is also responsible for similar problems in other parts of the world.

We live in a world of various economies within various nations under various forms of governance. The truth is that none of them are founded upon the most basic spiritual principles of economic theory that we find in God's Word. Tithing is the chief in those principles. And failing to tithe is actually to "rob God," - **STEALING FROM GOD** - which brings a curse (Malachi 3:8-9) - do you want to be blessed or cursed?

When the foundation of tithing is not in place, so many other matters are layered on top of it that create problems. The result is economic ups and downs and the cycles that we see in our national economies and our PERSONAL FINANCES. God's financial system—built on His Law of tithing—produces a balance and an evenness in life that gives us a firm footing; and when we understand that tithing teaches us to put God first, we don't get caught up in a way of life built on greed and materialism.

When we develop a relationship with God that has as one of its fundamental principles the law of tithing, we're then prepared to look toward God as the Creator, the giver of all. In the same way that Abraham viewed God.

Tithing is really a means of walking in the steps of our faithful spiritual father Abraham. We're told in Scriptures that, through Jesus the Anointed, we are the children of Abraham (Gal. 3:29). His heart was fully with God, and he showed it by giving a tenth of his treasure. The question for us is: Is OUR heart in the same place as Abraham's?

Experience a Deeper Relationship with God through Tithing

Tithing is one key to a very deep faith and reverence toward God. That's what we are seeing when we look at the story of Abraham who tithed to Melchizedek and set the example as the father of the faithful.

There's a larger lesson to draw from all of this. I've sat and talked with people many times over the years and taught them these principles out of the Scriptures and helped them gain a measure of the basic financial stability based upon God's Word.

I'm not a financial analyst. I'm not an expert in budgeting or finance in any way. But I do know a little bit about what God reveals as fundamental principle within His Word, the Bible.

I know what works because it has worked in my life, and I see that it works within the lives of individuals who step out and put God to the test in this matter as He says to do, resulting in great blessing (Malachi 3:10-12).

Tithing is not a means of getting something from God. Tithing

is not a bargain that we make with God. It's not an insurance policy. We have analysts, stockbrokers and financial planners to advise us on what we do with our money in that particular way. Tithing is something that defines a deep, personal relationship with God—and it works. When we get our priorities right, we are on the way toward greater financial stability in life, particularly as we apply other fundamental principles and laws that define stability.

Then we're on our way toward a better life—and, most importantly, we're on our way toward a deeply personal life of worship toward God. Tithing represents submitting to God's total claim on our lives.

I tithe because it is both a law and a blessing. It is a barometer, a guide, that points toward the fact that I need to put God first in all I do. I tithe because it finances God's work on earth today. I tithe because Abraham, the father of the faithful, tithed, and I want to follow in his footsteps.

Why should YOU tithe? Ask yourself the question, and begin to follow the important principles of tithing in your life, and stop stealing from God.

GOING FOR THE GOLD

About a month after the birth of my eighth baby, I read a story about a 47-year old woman who asked God for a ninth child, and God gave her a son. I decided to do the same and God amazingly gave me another baby. I could not believe it.

I realize that now my child-rearing years may very well be over, and I am preparing myself for this reality. yet, I still pray that God may see fit to bless us again with another child. Why not? He is my Abba. I can ask. At the same time



I am asking God for strength and humility to surrender to whatever He may have in store for my later years. I learned early on that having babies is temporary. In one short year those babies grow from little puddles in your arms to toddlers in your cupboards.

I've often heard people say when they see our large family, "You must have so much patience! I could never do what you are doing!" They assume that parents of many children are somehow more equipped to handle the challenges that come with raising a large family. On the one hand, God does give more grace when we are faced with greater difficulties. He is overwhelmingly generous that way. On the other hand, I have rough edges and besetting sins, too numerous to count, and it seems they all want to rear their ugly heads at various times of the day as I deal with the different relationships that happen in our family. Eleven people give us 65 relationship combinations. That's a set up for a lot of love and a lot of conflict. I have thrown my hands up in despair a few times and wondered what in the world I was doing—and why in the world I was doing it!

The missing piece is VISION. Am I happy? Am I fulfilled? Do I have what I want? I'm cross-eyed with shortness of vision. But when I open up God's Word and view my life from His vantage point, everything changes. I have to catch my breath, first of all, because the view is staggering. It goes on and on. Forever. And the way it meanders at first makes no sense; but then, as my vision adjusts, things clear up, and it dawns on me that I get to play a small, but significant part in the drama of history (His story).

Called to Die

Like Jesus Himself, I am called to die in order that I (and others) might find life (Mark 8:35, John 12:24 and Romans 12:1). If you think these verses don't apply to raising children, then you either 1) haven't experienced children yet, or 2) haven't meditated on these verses long enough. The day I got married I gave up the rights to my own life, my own way, my own terms (or at least, that was the idea). So did my husband. When we added children we watched the last trickle of autonomy slip away. Raising a family is a death to selfness. But it is also a finding of our identity in something greater than self: God.

Called to Love

Like Jesus, I am called to love unconditionally, bravely, freely, unreservedly, with longsuffering. Don't miss that word, LONG! (Ephesians 4:2, 1 Peter 1:22, and 1 John 4:7).

Called to Disciple

Like Jesus, I am called to disciple souls. The souls of my children are my first priority, with other souls following as God leads and time allows. Jesus worked with twelve. I have nine. The number is irrelevant, but I need to be focused on that mission and courageous to do it regardless of what the rest of the world does or says. In fact, if I don't disciple them, the world is more than happy to do it for me (making good citizens of Babylon out of them). NO thank you!

This calling to die, to love, and to disciple, is the highest and ultimately, the most rewarding calling of our lives. Will we take up the challenge and run the race God sets before us? Will we keep the prize in focus as we move forward with vision and purpose? Will we surrender our comfortable chair on the sidelines for the heat, the burn, the work of the race? Will we cross the finish line and be able

to look back and know we truly lived our short lives to the fullest?

Called to Pray

Having babies is one thing, but ultimately my deepest desire is to see them all saved by the blood of Jesus the Anointed. Since that day I found out I was pregnant for the first time, I have prayed almost daily:

"Father in heaven, SAVE the souls of every single one of my children (and grandchildren). Save them for eternity. Make them Yours. May you keep them in the palm of Your hand and never let them be plucked out. May each one seek to know and love You, the greatest treasure in the universe, more than the plastic baubles of this world. May they truly see, with spiritual eyes, your worth and beauty, and may they desire it more than anything else this world has to offer. Do not only save them, but save all of my posterity. Let there not be one black sheep among them, but let them all belong to You eternally, fulfilling the purpose for which you created them."

Called to Humility

But they maintain emotional and relational health because the individual members grieve over their sin, and say they are sorry and ask for forgiveness.

The families that struggle are the ones that have difficulty admitting sin. If the parents are prideful and refuse to admit wrongdoing, blaming other family members, or making excuses for the ways they hurt others, the family as a whole will suffer in untold ways. We can make a difference for eternity by simply humbling ourselves before our family members and learning the art of saying sorry and asking forgiveness. (Just saying we're sorry, by the way, doesn't cut it. The key is to ask the person we've wronged for forgiveness).

I'll never forget a testimony I read in which a young lady shared that her father would gather their family together once a week and ask if he had done anything to hurt any of them that week. If anyone shared a hurt, that father would immediately repent and ask forgiveness of that person. This young woman testified that because of this example, the hearts of the children and the parents were knit together in a special way.

I'm not raising my large family because I can handle it, I am a super mom, it is easy, and it's loads of fun. I've had babies because it was God's Will, and so I decided many years ago to trade my freedom for eternal dividends. I'm your run-of-the-mill selfish Wemmick, and I'm not doing this for nothing. I'm going for the gold. My dream is to stand around the throne of the Living God one day, hand in hand in a huge circle with my children, children's children, and their children and posterity, taking our marching orders (it's going to be fabulous) for our future productive, creative lives in eternity. All of us together. With Him, Forever.

FAITH AND THE FAMILY

In antiquity, the family often had a major religious function, although of a false variety. Ancestor worship was common in many cultures and still survives in this century. The Biblical emphasis was covenantal: the family under God and His Law by His sovereign grace.

In the Old Testament, we see that fathers had a priestly role, the duty to guide the family in worship, and in the sacrament of communion, the Passover. A son would ask, "What is the meaning of this that we do?" And the father as priest would then explain the meaning of the Passover and of God's salvation (Ex. 13:14ff). This, the central act of worship, was very strictly tied to the family. In the early church, while the Christian Passover was celebrated by the church, a chorus of boys would still ask the question, "What is the meaning of what we do?" In both the Hebrew family and the early church, the boys who asked the question were very young, perhaps about six years of age. But from their early years, they were expected to understand the meaning of salvation. In Scotland, after the Reformation, a central duty of church elders after a time came to be the visitation of all families in the congregation to question the children on their memorization and understanding of the Westminster Catechism. The family was the teacher, and the church verified the character of the teaching. The duty of the family was to *teach* the children the Faith. It was also the duty of the family to *educate* the children. Even as late as the establishment of the United States, a high percentage of the Founding Fathers were home schooled. Thus basic education in both the Bible and literacy and general learning were the routine duty of the family.

In Genesis 2:24 we are told that Adam and Eve were made "one flesh" by their union. This is plainly stated as a glorious religious fact. At the same time, from Abraham through Paul, we see that there must be a common faith: we are not to be unequally yoked to an unbeliever because marriage is a religious covenant. Both the physical and religious union are celebrated as godly facts. In the New Testament, the metaphor of marriage is applied to the Anointed and His ecclesia. While both sexuality and worship can be defiled, as created and intended by God, their purposes are glorious.

Thus the family comes into its own in every sphere as it serves God and lives by faith. *Faith* is our right relationship to God, and it is His gift to us. Faith is not simply believing, because the very devils believe and tremble (James 2:19). Faith is, according to Ephesians 2:8, "the gift of God." It is not our act of believing, "lest any man should boast," (Eph. 2:9), but a supernatural grace.

Thus, although the Christian family is a biological unit, it is, because it is redeemed by God's grace, more than a natural fact. It is a fact of grace.

Socialization

Man's life is both *personal* and *social*, and, very clearly, life is most personal and social in the family. We are never more fully and obviously personal in all our being than in the family, and nowhere else is our sense of community, our socialization, greater. State school critics of home schooling insist that the home-schooled miss out on socialization. This is an especially absurd claim because socialization in any healthy sense is best learned in the family. Moreover, when the family is the faith center, the personal and the social aspects of life are learned under grace.

One of the curses of school life in the years since the secular revolution has been the rise of gangs. Earlier in the century, if two boys disagreed and fought, other boys formed a circle around them and broke up the fight if one of the two fought unfairly. Now a disagreement can lead to a gang assault on one boy.

Gang activity is socialization, non-Christian socialization, and the major form of such activity in many areas. There is nothing good as such in socialization: it can be either good or bad, and in a non-Christian context, is normally bad. Its most common expression in many non-Christian circles are gang activities and lawless sexuality. Non-Christian socialization leads to immorality and the depersonalization of life. We need to make clear to these humanistic champions of socializing the child that their method is precisely the problem we want to avoid.

At present, many churches are in crisis because too many members' children are in state schools and their characters have been shaped by Jesus' enemies. Humanistic education denies that there is truth: it denies God. As one writer has stated it, citing Naum Gabo, "There is no such thing as absolute truth or falsity...Anything and everything can be both."¹ What is also being said is that there is no absolute meaning, if any meaning at all.

Grow or Die

Neither time nor man stand still. Our faith either grows or dies. We should not be surprised when artist Jean Dubuffet said, "I believe very much in the values of savagery; I mean, instinct, passion, mood, violence, madness."² We see all around us a polarization taking place, and, as unbelief deepens, so too does faith. Erich Kahler spoke some years ago of "the outspoken attempt to *produce incoherence*, ... a veritable cult of incoherence of sheer senselessness

and aimlessness."³

As against this, Christian faith is becoming more consistently Biblical, more coherent, and more directed. Whereas a generation ago, children simply grew up biologically without too much direction, more and more Christian families are providing a strong focus and objective. Their children are remarkable in their faith and goals.

We are in the early stages of one of history's most dramatic struggles and shifts. At one time, the church dominated civilization, but during most of history the state has been the commanding force. Now we see a growing cynicism directed at the state. Now we are seeing a double movement. On the one hand, humanism seeks a world state, a new Tower of Babel. On the other hand, the family in Christ is decentralizing society by beginning with the education of its own children. The statist see the full extent of this threat and are attempting to destroy this movement. In this battle, the family is both gaining ground and is increasingly winning. God warned Zechariah against all who despise the day of small things (Zech. 4:10). To do so is to despise God's work among us.*

(Remember: the reason Israel became *more and mightier* than the Egyptians is because they remained together as a large extended family, and lived separate from the Egyptians, and did not send their children to Egyptian schools!!)

REWARDS OF HOMESCHOOLING

It's not unusual to look for positive feedback when we're involved in a consuming commitment. Rewards along the way can confirm that we are headed in the right direction. They can also raise our level of involvement. Although a final reward may not be the reason for our labours, it would certainly help to add excitement to our efforts. So in the interest of encouragement, let's consider the rewards of being a Christian home educating family.

ATMOSPHERE

One of the great rewards of home education is the ability to orchestrate the family atmosphere. Parents can determine the tone, quality, and character they want in their home environment. Then they can oversee the process of developing their family vision. Time, just plain time, is one of the main resources for this task.

Time spent together allows family members to get to know each other. Time working together provides opportunities to smooth out rough patches in relationships. Although there is no guarantee of perfection, the hours home educating families spend together do give parents more of an opportunity to accomplish family harmony. There are numerous occasions throughout each day to work toward that goal. Our family and many other home educating families are experiencing the rewards of close family relationships.

Home educating families have the freedom to respond to God and His Word. We can submit every situation and event, whether it occurs inside or outside the family, to Scripture. We can demonstrate for our children how to understand our world through the truth of God's Word without interference. Then, as we seek ways to respond in accordance with Scripture, we can share with them a life of obedience.

We can focus on God's standards and guidelines above all others. When children spend time in other educational settings, they are not only outside the influence of their parents, they are also under the influence of others. This influence may be (and more than likely will be) in direct opposition to the family's values and goals. Watch also for the effects of this outside influence when they start a job.

This is not to say that children should never be away from their parents. There is a difference between being exposed to other ways of thinking and being dredged in them. Taking an art class or playing on an athletic team is considerably different from spending six to eight hours a day, five days a week being in a government school classroom or bad work environment. Each family needs to decide what the balance is regarding this issue.

We have found experiences in other settings, when limited and appropriate to maturity levels, to be valuable training exercises. They can provide excellent opportunities to reinforce Biblical values. We've had some of our best conversations with our daughters as a result of outside experiences. In this way, distractions are restrained from causing strife and turned into occasions for promoting the truth of Christianity.

Activities

In addition to being able to create an atmosphere that is conducive to the transmission of faith and a Biblical worldview, home educating parents are also able to incorporate activities that contribute to the family vision.

The activities we choose to include in our family life

add more than information or fun or motivation. They also create memories and warm family bonds. When our daughters were younger, we had a regular spring routine. On the first windy day we would go to a local park and fly kites. We still reminisce about all the laughing and running we did and Dad's bat kite that dove into the ocean. (from 1992 to 2003, CIM had annual concerts/camps with singing and performances, and invited speakers - but then it just died out. Now it seems no-one is interested in continuing, although the next generation should be picking up the ball).

Family traditions are another type of activity that foster close family relationships. When our oldest daughter was born, we thought a lot about how we wanted to celebrate Christmas. We decided that we wanted the advent season to be a special time of reviewing the whole breadth of the Bible and not just Luke 2, and starting at Genesis 1:1. We now include our grandchildren as we read our way across God's Word. These episodes of special family times can be compared to the stars in a constellation. As each one is added to the collection, the image becomes more recognizable as the object it represents.

The full constellation may not be perfect, but it will resemble the image it's meant to portray. The more Biblical, family-oriented activities, memories and traditions we include as we work our way along the path toward our vision, the more our families will resemble that vision. The two hours we spent each year flying kites are several bright stars in our constellation. During that time we were rejoicing in the family God made and enjoying the precious time we had together.

Sometimes the star may be only a pinprick of light. For example, in the midst of ongoing sibling rivalry the aggressor gives in to the passive child and hands over a toy unbidden. At bedtime a child prays for someone and you realize the poignancy of his request. There are fleeting conversations and events that reflect what we really believe God wants our families to be. These moments, large and small, are being joined together in the constellation of our family vision.

Future Rewards

There are rewards in the future that we, and our nation, will receive as a result of our home education efforts. From our full-time commitment to raise our children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord will come God-seeking descendants and a better Nation. We learn in Exodus that God's blessings are generational. They are for our children, our grandchildren, our whole family line (provided they remain obedient).

*"You shall not bow down to them [idols] or worship them; for I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me **and keep my commandments**" (Ex. 20:5-6).*

The expression of God's love cannot be fully marked or measured. His Word says that children are in line to receive His blessings through the obedience of their parents. Therefore, Christian parents who decide to pursue a home education program out of obedience to God's call are opening the door for special benefits to come to their children.*
