OVERCOMERS OF WHAT

Scripture Reading: 1 John 5:4-5

In 1989 I attended the Scriptures for America Family Bible Camp in Colorado hosted by the late Pastor Pete Peters, along with approximately 400 other Identity Christians. This is back when our movement was burgeoning with new converts and unfortunately fringe elements. It was the first time I was introduced to the salient implications of the Christian overcomer. Peters started his message by asking the audience "Do you want to be an overcomer?" Prior to giving his evening sermon, I remember that day, questionnaires were handed out asking, "What do you have to have more than anything else to be an overcomer?" And he played a tape recording of people trying to answer that question also. A lot of people said faith or trust or Christ, but that evening Peters said "Nobody got the right answer." That may have been because the question was asked tongue in cheek because his answer was so rhetorical in his sphere of sophistry.

Then, as if he received lightning bolts from Heaven, he yelled out his answer... "You've got to have something to overcome!!!" Well, duh ... yeah. I remember at the time, that after Peters embarrassed so many people, who did get it right with 1 John 5:4, that he needed to overcome his self-serving attitude. But, I'm grateful that he broached the subject, which decades later has become a spiritual imperative for the serious Christian. Obviously, it has not been taken seriously by churchianity, otherwise we wouldn't have the excessive amount of egregious problems to overcome compared to 1989. A deeper understanding of the overcomer is certainly racial in nature and the first thing you need to be, to be an overcomer, is that you need to be White. As I recall, I put down 'Israelite' on the questionnaire... crickets. That's what you need, your identity.

In my initial research, I googled 'overcomer' and the first website I went to had a book that was published in Nigeria. Evidently, a black Nigerian found something to overcome; maybe it was the White man and he dreamt of a Nigerian Jesus. Can a Nigerian change his skin or a leopard its spots (Jer. 13:23)? I modified it from Ethiopian, but it's the same principle. But, for our purposes, it's intriguing that the rest of the verse is wildly translated as to whether the negro can do good with such a track record of being evil. I'll give you two poignant examples of what I'm talking about; the first is from the KJV, which reads, "then may ye also do good, that are accustomed to do evil." Whereas the NIV states, "Neither can you do good who are accustomed to doing evil." What a contrast. The LXX settles the dispar-

ity in the form of a conditional sentence i.e., "If the Ethiopian shall change his skin, or the leopardess her spots, then shall ye be able to do good, having learnt evil." Jeremiah was such a racist.

This begs the question: can anybody change their skin pigmentation? The answer is rhetorical (NO!). Furthermore, can the Nigerian be an overcomer if it's impossible for them to do good? Even if they write a book about overcomers? The point and context of Jer. 13:23 is not the swarthy breeds of Africans, but the evil of Judah was so ingrained as to be incapable of spontaneous rehabilitation. The contemporary parallel in White society today is the inability of our people to overcome every nook and cranny of *universalism*. For some of our people, the idea that all human beings were created equal and therefore equally loved by God is so ingrained into their thinking, that they will most likely miss the boat, the ark of salvation that saves us from the flood of aliens. It doesn't make any difference if you disbelieve the former or the latter if you believe they were created by God or if they can even be considered a race i.e. 'kind after kind.' They, the universalists, refuse and reject the biblical mandate for racism. They will never overcome and repent of the evil jew that foments an egalitarian mindset. In Europe today, because they cannot overcome, they are being overrun. In yet another 'Black Lives Matter' riot in Milwaukee, because of law enforcement

shooting a black thug who was about to shoot the cop (with a stolen gun he just used in a burglary), the mob was heard to be chanting "Beat up every White person." It was so savage, that the Governor declared a state of emergency. The media whores and political pundits were desperate in trying to spin the same old tune that not all Negroes are like that. (just like we hear in Australia). Yes they are and the Bible says so. If we know the media lies, should we trust anything they say? Psalms 2:1 does not ask '*why do some of the heathen rage?*' and then quantifies it with the belief people have in their foolish imaginations. The verse is racial; why do the coloreds have this violent streak and White people try to rationalize that they're not all the like that? Racial equality is an imaginary creed brought forth by the Marxist cultural war against God. It's the same canard with the nauseating mantra of good jews and bad jews. Don't get me wrong with our own people; there's some good and some bad. But all jews, all coloreds are inferior to us, because their genes are not from God('s anointing of Sarah's womb, like Isaac was)..

One can always make an anomalous argument (a fluke in the scheme of things), which is far from deductive reasoning to ascertain the truth. Generally speaking, us and them are polar opposites and is the point of Gen. 3:15. They can never be overcomers, the tribes of serpentines, a metaphor presenting the animal type, a creepy slithering poisonous snake, most analogous to its own spiritual nature, if their destiny was to "bruise his heel." In other words, the adversaries of God would be at ground level, of the earth and not Heaven, continually nipping and biting at our feet, our walk with Christ, preventing our redemption. God has put enmity or perpetual war between the racially pure progeny of Adam and Eve, a godly people, and the racially impure progeny of all non-Adamites, a wicked hybrid. The wicked may even purport to be Christian and brag about the many wonderful things they have done, but Christ shall tell them, "*Never have I known you! Depart from Me, you workers of lawlessness*" Mt. 7:23. Of course, our Lord knew who they were, calling them congenital murderers and liars (John 8:44), but the God of Creation is saying He does not recognize them and will never acknowledge them as part of what He created for Himself. You know, it's not only seeking the Truth, but overcoming the lies; that's the foundation of our faith. The truth is they are an aberration of life and the Bible makes every effort to qualify what they were and are with the ancient languages to write the Word of God. Once we have this key to identify the enemy, we are able to overcome it. Woe to those who don't have the eyes to see it. Gen. 3:15 is also saying that the head of the serpent shall be bruised or a better translation is crushed; they are ... dead beasts walking. There are two seeds and it's us vs. them. Never at any time has God known them. We understand the word "known" or variations, in a biblical sense, to sometimes mean the intimate consummation of a marriage. God was married to the race of Jacob-Israel. God could not have 'known' other so called races or mongrels, otherwise He would have violated His own Law prohibiting miscegenation. (Amos 3:2)

It's interesting how this sermon evolved from a conversation I was having in the Christogenea Forum. The first question posed was: what exactly happens in between the Fall of Babylon and the Kingdom of God? The short answer I gave him was that after Babylon falls, it appears to be a pretty tight schedule; God's people "*come out of her*" (Rev. 18:4), preparing for the Marriage Supper of the

Lamb, which is the Second Coming of Christ and the destruction of His and our enemies. We can have no Kingdom without a King right?

Then we were talking about Christian Identity books and book reviews. Bill Finck had this to say, "To me there is a psychological danger associated with investing in books, that most Christians are not even cognizant of. Think about it. When you make a decision to buy someone's books, you are investing in that person. When people read those books which they have invested in, they do not want to think that they made a bad decision. But Christian Identity has a long way to go. Most Christian Identity "pastors" throughout its entire history are still caught in the mire of the traditions of men. One such popular individual, who is a good man but who is stuck in a lot of Baptist tradition, does a lot of very good work in certain areas. But he teaches a planet-wide universal flood. And he teaches that to be a Christian one must celebrate traditional church sacraments of water-baptism and communion. So to me, those things nullify much of the good work he does, because he

continues to be confused on the issue of race, in part, and also because he seeks to keep his readers bound to the traditions of men. So how can I recommend his books, without writing long disclaimers? This is the dilemma I find myself in with many Christian Identity writers whose work you cannot see unless you pay for it. The internet is a wonderful medium. It allows me to make all of my writing available freely."

I added to the discussion, quoting Mt. 10:8 "Freely you have received, freely give." When I first began reading

Identity material I had an insatiable appetite for information. I didn't care if I disagreed with it or not; I wanted to be knowledgeable in what others thought... in the marketplace of ideas. Therefore, I could sift through all positions and arrive at my own conclusions. Sure, there were some authors who lacked literary skills and others who indulged in their pet doctrines. After awhile, I could be more selective in who I wanted to read, because I knew the investment of time that some writers put into their research and others who simply speak off the cuff. But, the Bible does say "*Buy the truth*" (Prov. 23:23) and that should begin with decent Bible translations and the best concordances and lexicons money can buy. Each of us should be scholars of the Word, reading and studying. Christian Identity is unique in this respect in that many are self taught, depending on no church or experts for them to understand the basic message. In fact, I've heard from some families that they discovered the Good News without ever hearing of Identity, simply by growing in grace together and allowing God's Spirit to communicate. The Christian Identity message is the most important thing in life, so we should never make merchandise of God. By the same token, I believe that God still sends messengers of deliverance who have the gift of elucidation for what is relevant, and that of course is the racial message. I agree with Bill and the blessings we are afforded in this day and age with a technology to provide the message freely."

And then in conclusion, I made this passing remark, "There's never going to be a perfect book as most authors worth their salt will tell you. But, we Christians can perfect our lives (Mt. 5:48) by gleaning from their work." By perfect I don't mean sinlessness, but making our lives complete in Christ through whatever tools facilitate our learning. Many are called to duty to feed the sheep, but few have the discipline or sacrifice to pursue a full time devo-

tion to the Truth. *"The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few"* Luke 10:2. Nonetheless, because of that reality that permeates our movement, we should not lose sight of the fact that a few men of God do what they do as a labor of love and have faith that the Lord will provide for their needs. I think the days of conventional ministry are waning and that the paradigm will be that of overcomers, overcoming the world outside the four walls of a church building. But that's another story for another day. Perhaps someone will write a book about it." Well, that's all it took for our friend in South Africa, Nayto, to ask, "What would it take to hear your version of the story?" And that's all it took for me to get going on the subject, which I've mentioned over the years, but never encapsulated in a sermon.

So, this is the day that the Lord has made and we will rejoice and be glad in Him, learning that we are the sons of the living God; and the heirs of the promise are the overcomers who foment the transition from the Church Age to the Kingdom Age. Bible chronology has always been somewhat difficult to determine the sequence of events, especially the prophetic order of things that have not yet come to pass. The Kingdom of God has always been near and within the grasp of man to bring forth the fruits thereof. Adam had the Kingdom and he blew it and we've been trying to retrieve it ever since. Next was the 12 tribes of Israel, the Age of Judges and Patriarchs to bring forth the Kingdom and it failed in a divorce case. Each new era, God reduces those held responsible for ushering in the Kingdom Age. After 2000 years we are coming to the close of the Church Age, which was a spiritual Israel within physical Israel, as it turned into an apostate church. So next we have in God's plan for the ages coming up, the Kingdom Age, in which a Remnant of overcomers bring forth the fruits. And this time it will succeed. The Remnant of overcomers will be so few, that the glory of God's power will be all the more greater in victory. In fact, it can only be supernatural, which most men cannot imagine; they reserve their imaginations for evil. There have always been overcomers, but it is during this period of time from the fall of Babylon to the Kingdom, that the overcomers will fulfill John 14:12, *"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do, he will do also; and greater works than these he will do; because I go to the Father."* So this is something that we have not yet seen on a scale that would make the world take notice and yet it is prior to the Second Coming, because Christ is still in Heaven. People may wonder why verse 14 promises that if we ask anything in His authority, that He will do it, has not come to pass. After all, people ask all the time and don't get what they want. Maybe it's because this is only reserved for the overcomers who would only ask for the things that are within the will of God. Think of it... anything, including the supernatural, will be granted.

What else besides having a godly racial consciousness is required of the overcomer? Nothing short of overcoming all that is in the world will suffice, being approved of God and this is summarized in I John 2:16 overcoming, "the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life." If a protegee' of overcoming the world does not have the fruits of the Holy Spirit, he may not be qualified to enter the Kingdom of God. The verse before the aforementioned Mt. 7:23 says, "Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord! will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who

does the will of My Father in heaven" (verse 21). Everyone is not going to enter the Kingdom, because God does not love everyone, especially them whom the Lord has never known; those mongrels who were never meant to be born. This unwanted element was spoken of before the Bible was written, as depicted in the Zodiac, the glory of the stars, where we witness again the analogy of animals, such as the scorpion (Scorpio) who is the Great Oppressor of God's Creation, to whom the last sign, Leo i.e. the Lion, specifically the Lion of Judah, Jesus the Christ, will be the coming Judge and Conqueror of the dragon, serpent etc, all of whom were born of the earth below and not Heaven (which God called "good"). Thus, Adam was to only live his life solely upon the Tree of Life, the grace and blessings from above. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. Those who belong to Christ have crucified the flesh [all that is in the world] with its passions and lusts. Since we live by the Spirit, we should also walk by the Spirit" Gal. 5:22-25.

Please note again that dangerous fanged creatures are targeting your feet, your walk. Overcoming the world is a spiritual activity, not religious rites and rituals. A good example is the choice we have in determining God's will for us to either immerse ourselves in His Word or immersing ourselves in a baptismal pool. The latter merely makes one wet, it does not change the heart to obey Christ. There's no magical incantation in or out of Christianity that can do anything except exacerbate one's wicked imagination; leave all that occult garbage for superstitious mongrels.

There's a racial alien that God does not know and likewise we do not know. Not even a trillion dollars of multi-cultural diversity can make us familiar with the mind of the heathen, as hard as our children try to emulate them. We can only know the blood of our own kind as God created us with the Tree of Life, which is something else that is coming back (Rev. 22:18). Our own genetics demands total separation, because it is God's will. The fruits of the Spirit can only be applied among ourselves. Why? God says He will "put enmity between" the serpentine people and the progeny of Adamkind (Gen. 3:15). There can be no love, joy or peace between us and them. 2016 is a violent year of an escalating race war. If you think gentleness will alleviate a hate crime against you, then you're sorely mistaken and out of touch with God's will. Listen to this: "Your sons and your daughters shall be given to another people, while your eyes look on and fail with longing for them all day long, but you shall be helpless. A nation that you have not known shall eat up the fruit of your ground and of all your labors, and you shall be only oppressed and crushed continually, so that you are driven mad by the sights that your eyes see" Deut. 28:32-34. Something to look forward to if you're not an overcomer. As you listened to that Scripture, did it occur to you, that's exactly what's happening to America right

now? Our God commands us not to race mix, socially or biologically. All non-Whites throughout the world have no such commandment, either secular or religious. The overcomer surrenders whatever illusions of free will he may have had and puts himself in the hands of the Master. Throughout Scripture we are given assurances that we can endure unto the end and John 16:33 tells us *"These things I have spoken unto you, that in Me you might have peace. In the world you shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."* Jesus is the quintessential overcomer, the template for every generation to follow, especially in the latter times. As in the days of Noah, a Remnant of overcomers, perfect in their generations (genetics), will bear the fruits of the Spirit and defeat the temptations of all that is in the world. We are not a race of whiners and demanding a redistribution of wealth; we do not cry 'the world owes me a living.' We are the race of workers and we work for God! We create civilizations and inventions, because we were created. Every one of those great societies have fallen because of mongrels who were created by mixed breeding. The two cannot coexist and that is why Mystery Babylon will implode.

Once we are cognizant of dissonance, we can discern what promotes our fears and take command of the pure meme of Christianity. Our lives will have meaning and purpose. We will not be swept away by every wind of doctrine. Cognitive dissonance is two competing beliefs or ideas, which are so close together and yet so far apart, that if held simultaneously, it creates a mentality to modify brand new thoughts in order to minimize the dissonance or hypocrisy and at the same time remain in their comfort zone. Now the false accuser is the mongrel or mongrel-minded who is the merchant of temptations and the enemy of Truth. But wait there's more, if we act now we get closer... closer to what? Next verse (8), *"Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded."* Isn't that what the "mark of the beast" targets? Our hand and mind? But, the White Christian Israelite puts on the mind of Christ and we place our lives in His hands. It's fighting evil with good. We are going to chop down that tree of knowledge of good and evil and pull it up by its roots and burn the hell out of it. That's what overcomers do. Wolves eat sheep, that's what they do. And they're on a feeding frenzy, pulling out the pumping heart of Christian prey, exalting themselves above God, saying they are God. Don't tell me America is a nation of tolerance Mr. Trump. That's not what America is about to God.

If things get really bad with more of Obama's self pity army of parasites and arsonists, with something worse than 9/11 as Trump opined the other day, with more Clinton corruption that goes unindicted, with the geopolitical warfare in the Middle East getting nuclear and many more things that could drive people mad from what they see on TV, then the Christian is going to have to equip themselves with something that will maintain their sanity in a world diving headfirst into madness. I don't mean angry mad, I mean the mad spoken of in the verse we just read in Deut. 28:34, *"you are driven mad by the sights that your eyes see"*; Strong's #H7696 defines it as *"to rave through insanity."* How is the whole world deceived according to Rev. 18:23? It's through "sorceries" or pharmaceuticals. Can you overcome, having eyes that see?

I was just reading about the legendary musician/actor Kris Kristofferson, who had been diagnosed with incurable late-stage Alzheimer's dementia and he was slipping fast until his wife made him switch doctors. And sure enough, it was a misdiagnosis in which the witch doctors were feeding him with drugs that did nothing but make him lose his sanity. This went on for three years until real medical people found out that he had tested positive for Lyme Disease. The medical establishment says there are no known causes of Alzheimers (although many researchers think aluminum is one of the main culprits) and consistently fail to mention the many drug-induced (iatrogenic) causes of dementia. The term "iatrogenic" means doctor, drug or surgery-caused disease. It is a taboo subject in America today with the gods of AMA, maybe because it fits in perfectly with the Protocols of jewry to reduce the world's population. For some people, knowing that you're the object of murder and lies, and there's nothing you can seemingly do about it, could drive a person mad, into a paranoid personality. To borrow two book titles Murder By Injection and The Perfect Crime says it all. Our lives don't last that long while we're on earth, but when it's cut short by way of deception, we have two choices. We can be in a state of denial, cognitive dissonance or in the early stages of dementia. The other choice is Jesus Christ and to be an overcomer like Him. Ask yourself: was Christ ever overwhelmed due to any number of irreconcilable situations and thus delusional? No way; not even fasting for 40 days in the wilderness compromised His thinking.

If things get so crazy, in whatever manifestation, whether it's a suspension of the elections and Obama

declares Martial Law, or nationwide race riots, or weird weather affecting tens of thousands displaced from their homes, or a HAARP-induced earthquake at Yellowstone, San Andreas or the New Madrid seismic zone, or a food shortage and trucking crisis (if trucks stop rolling for three days, the shelves on grocery stores will be empty), or an economic collapse of the dollar, or any other of dozens of worst case scenarios that millions of people will “see” on TV, then who is going to be prepared for these end time events? The people with a 20 year supply of freeze dried food? The people in underground bunkers? The people with gold and silver? The people with guns?

George Washington had a vision of a dark cloud hovering over our nation and expanded to intercontinental conflicts and it was not good. A cloud of madness is descending upon America; we are living in perilous times. If I may quote the third and last phase of his vision (and I take it with a grain of salt) he said, “I dimly saw these vast armies devastate the whole country and burn the villages, towns and cities... As my ears listened to the thundering of the cannon, clashing of sounds and the shouts and cries of millions in mortal combat, I again heard the mysterious voice saying, “Son of the Republic, look and learn.” When this voice had ceased, the dark shadowy angel placed his trumpet once more to his mouth, and blew a long and fearful blast. Instantly a light as of a thousand suns shone down from above me, and pierced and broke into fragments the dark cloud which enveloped America.”

If chaos is headed our way, and I've been hearing this for over 30 years, it's all under divine control. The above is not a biblical prophecy, but it addresses calamity upon the nations of the world. The curse of Deut. 28:34 is real and when our people turn their back on their God, whether they're a professing Christian or not, it says there will be ravaging insanity among the masses. Those preppers who think they got their ducks in row, but know nothing of the bride of Christ making herself ready (Rev. 19:7), will not be prepared, because they left out the most important survival tool a White man can have... hope. Those Rapturists who think they're going to float off to heaven will be the most disillusioned and without hope, because they had no love for the truth and believed a lie. They listened to wolves in sheep's clothing and learned to love the stranger and his strange gods. I never get tired of repeating II Chron. 19:2 i.e. the cause and effect of loving and helping the wrong people, the result of which is the wrath of God. Those who put their trust in a man who is not an overcomer, will themselves fail to overcome anything. The blind leading the blind will not overcome the ditch. Without overcoming the world, there is no hope of making it through the valley/ditch of the shadow of death, where you will need hope more than anything else. We can live for about 40 days without food, 3 days without water, but only 1 second without hope. The fascination with the zombie genre is a celebration of hopelessness. It's a mockery of the Tree of Life. But how will anyone know and understand? Most people never read their Bibles, either for themselves or to their children; and only a few even remember to pray before and after meals. Therefore:

Things will get worse before they get better for the hopeless. Things will get better before they get better for the overcomers. It's much like the impossible situation Israel found herself in at the Red Sea. Our founding fathers faced the formidable Red Coats. And today we encounter the red dragon of communist Edomites. (Take note of what politicians wear RED ties!) The overcomers have always lived by faith, whereas the rest of the multitude of Israel lives and reacts with murmuring and fear. Overcomers are God fearing, not fearing the world. “*In the fear of the Lord is confidence of strength, and there shall be hope for His children*” Prov. 14:26. “*Listen to Me, you who know righteousness, a people in whose heart is My law; do not fear the reproach of man, nor be dismayed at their revilings*” Isaiah 51:7. An overcomer is not a “born again” jew, but the opposite of a jew, a “begotten from above” Israelite. Every White person has the potential to be an overcomer through faith. An overcomer believes that Jesus was the Son of God (I John 5:5). A person who rejects the Son of God is not of God; this is an antichrist (I John 4:3).

Who is the idiot that would have you believe that simply by capitalizing the word 'antichrist' turns it into a singular individual? When John said that even in his day, there were many antichrists (I John 2:18), should we believe differently, that they all just disappeared? John said that he was writing to us, Israelites, because we knew the Truth, and “*that no lie is of the truth*” (verse 21). And then in the next verse (22) says, “*Who is a liar, but he who denies that Jesus is the Christ (Anointed)? He is antichrist that denies the Father and Son.*” I do not believe that any Messianic jew or serpent seedline jew or zuwr stranger can ever be anything but an antichrist, for the very simple reason that all of them deny the Kinsman Redeemer and the Good News of a race-specific Covenant People and that will be the overcomers that overcome them; we will destroy the destroyers. “*And the nations were enraged, and Your wrath came, and the time came for the dead to be judged, and the time to reward Your bond-servants the prophets and the saints and those who fear Your name, the small and the great, and to destroy those who destroy the earth*” Rev. 11:18.

Who runs the world? It's the people who are ruining the world. The antichrists don't seem to be too concerned over something that was said in ancient times, to wit: “*for all the earth is Mine*” Ex. 19:5. No matter how hard they try, no man or beast can own the land forever. Land is one of the four necessary elements for a kingdom, but there is no honor among thieves. If you can see the world, you'll see how the worldly are fighting among themselves for turf and surf. There's a great money war going on as to what will be the standard currency for the world. Bank lives don't matter, the predestination of bankers is already a done deal. God has always run His own Creation, regardless of the aberrations of nature, and will pull the plug on His enemies at His appointed time. The fatal flaw among the global elite is that they are never satiated with enough power, there is only big fish swallowing smaller fish. On the other hand, we Christians fish for good fish and throw away the bad fish until all that remains are the good fish; then there's

going to be a big fish fry at the lake of fire. I believe that is what God is doing with His overcomers, an elite group of Christian Identity Elijah missionaries, working under the radar that ADL fat cats can only write half-wit diatribes about. Our mission is under divine protection. We are the secret change agents of God.

The blueprint for setting up the Kingdom has always been around, but misunderstood either deliberately or foolishly. I am a book worm that devours every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. The Law tells us, *"If you buy a Hebrew slave, he shall serve for six years; but on the seventh he shall go out as a free man without payment"* Ex. 21:2. However, this is not a permanent release. If he still owes more on his debt, he had to return after his Sabbath year to continue working as a slave. Only in the year of a Jubilee was this debt fully canceled, unless he succeeded in

paying off the debt earlier. This is how God judged Adam: *"cursed is the ground for your sake; in toil you shall eat of it all the days of your life"* Gen. 3:17. This means the ground itself, the land, would absorb the debt note of Adam and would have authority over him and his children, in that the soil would provide the slave with food and a dwelling place. He would have to work and toil on behalf of the earth to live. All of his descendents, the White race, would likewise be enslaved to the ground for six years. Here's the kicker: *"But do not overlook this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day"* II Peter 3:8. Have we overlooked this one minor detail hmmm? That if we apply Adam's judgment to the Big Picture of God's plan for the ages, our entire race was sentenced to 6000 years of slavery to the unglorified, physical, carnal, made of the dust of the ground body. THE TRUE PROSPERITY GOSPEL

One of the favorite themes of many of our modern ministers is the "prosperity gospel." This term usually implies that a "love offering" sent to their ministry will result in an outpouring of money and other material blessings to the giver. Another popular term for this is "seed-faith money" - bundle it over to their ministry and God will bless you with bundles of money in return. Worldly ministers measure prosperity by worldly wealth. Mammon (Greek, mammonas, the personification and deification of wealth), has become the highest good.

This worship of mammon leads to the despising of God's Law which is antithetical to it. The Law of God represents His authority, His very Being. Jesus expressed it well in saying, *"No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon."* (Matt. 6:24, Luk. 16:13). (Listen to N-128!)

Yet, prosperity is actually a favorite subject in God's Word. It is a recurring theme in Scripture that those who follow God's Laws, His principles of conduct, will prosper. Evangelical scholar, Benedikt Otzen, informs us, "The general attitude to the law [in Scripture] is often voiced in an imagery connected with the word 'way' (hodos and euodoo, to accompany, help on the way, prosper). It is no coincidence that we already met these words as a 'Leitmotiv'." (Tobit and Judith, 2002, p.35).

A "leit-motiv" is a leading motif or recurring theme. In contrast to modern theology which has abolished the moral

laws of God, either in whole or in part, Scripture not only affirms the law but as a leading theme promises prosperity to those who follow it.

The twenty-eighth chapter of Deuteronomy is a classic example of the relationship between divine law and prosperity, and it is truly "good news," (which the word 'gospel' means): "And it shall come to pass, if thou shalt hearken diligently unto the voice of the LORD thy God, to observe and to do all his commandments which I command thee this day, that the LORD thy God will set thee on high above all nations of the earth: And all these blessings shall come on thee, and overtake thee, if thou shalt hearken unto the voice of the LORD thy God. Blessed shalt thou be in the city, and blessed shalt thou be in the field. Blessed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy ground, and the fruit of thy cattle, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep. Blessed shall be thy basket and thy store. Blessed shalt thou be when thou comest in, and blessed shalt thou be when thou goest out. The LORD shall cause thine enemies that rise up against thee to be smitten before thy face: they shall come out against thee one way, and shall flee before thee seven ways. The LORD shall command the blessing upon thee in thy storehouses, and in all that thou settest thine hand unto; and he shall bless thee in the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee. The LORD shall establish thee an holy (separated) people unto himself, as he hath sworn, if thou shalt keep the commandments of the LORD thy God, and walk in his ways. And all the people of the earth shall see that thou art called by the name of the LORD; and they shall be afraid of thee. And the LORD shall make thee plenteous in goods, in the fruit of thy body, and in the fruit of thy cattle, and in the fruit of thy ground, in the land which the LORD sware unto thy fathers to give thee. The LORD shall open unto thee his good treasure, the heavens to give rain unto thy land in his season, and to bless all the work of thine hand: and thou shalt lend unto many nations, and thou shalt not borrow. And the LORD shall make thee the head, and not the tail; and thou shalt be above only, and thou shalt not be beneath; if that thou hearken unto the commandments of the LORD thy God, which I command thee this day, to observe and to do them." (Deut 28:1-13).

After many more verses of this "prosperity gospel," God informs us what will occur if we reject His Law-teachings: "And thou shalt grope at noonday, as the blind gropeth in darkness, and thou shalt not prosper in thy ways: and thou shalt be only oppressed and spoiled evermore, and no man shall save thee." (Deut 28:29).

This theme appears again in the Book of Numbers: "And Moses said, Wherefore now do ye transgress the commandment of the LORD? but it shall not prosper." (Num. 14:41). In verse nine this attitude is described as a rebellion against God.

The link between law and prosperity appears again in Deuteronomy following the Exodus from Egypt: "Keep therefore the words of this covenant, and do them, that ye may prosper in all that ye do." (Deut. 29:9).

After Moses' death the LORD said to Joshua, "Only be thou strong and very courageous, that thou mayest observe to do according to all the Law, which Moses my servant commanded thee: turn not from it to the right hand or to the

left, that thou mayest prosper withersoever thou goest." (Josh. 1:7).

King David, who was a prophetic type of Jesus, gave this wise advice to his son Solomon on his death-bed: "And keep the charge of the LORD thy God, to walk in his ways, to keep his statutes, and his commandments, and his judgments, and his testimonies, as it is written in the law of Moses, that thou mayest prosper in all that thou doest, and whithersoever thou turnest thyself." (1 Kings 2:3; cf. 1 Chron. 22:11-13).

The prophet Zechariah was stoned in return for his wise counsel, "And the Spirit of God came upon Zechariah the son of Jehoiada the priest, which stood above the people, and said unto them, Thus saith God, Why transgress ye the commandments of the LORD, that ye cannot prosper? because ye have forsaken the LORD, he hath also forsaken you." (2 Chron. 24:20). The prophet Ezekiel echoed similar sentiments in saying, "Shall he escape that doeth such things? or shall he break the covenant, and be delivered?" (Ezek. 17:15b).

The Book of Psalms begins with these words of advice, "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful. But his delight is in the Law of the LORD; and in his Law doth he meditate day and night. (Do YOU?). And he shall be like a tree planted by the rivers of water, that bringeth forth his fruit in his season; his leaf also shall not wither; and whatsoever he doeth shall prosper."

At times it seems that the wicked prosper while the righteous perish (read Psalm 73). The prophet Daniel pointed out, however, that this situation is temporary: "And the king shall do according to his will; and he shall exalt himself, and magnify himself above every god, and shall speak marvelous things against the God of gods, and shall prosper till the indignation be accomplished: for that which is determined shall be done." (Dan. 11:36).

With the coming Messianic kingdom and return of the Messiah to reign, God and His Law shall be supreme: "Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will raise unto David a righteous Branch, and a King shall reign and prosper, and shall execute judgment and justice in the earth." (Jer. 23:5).

Returning to the New Testament, the Apostle John wrote, "Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth." (3 John 1:2).

As we enter further into 2019, we add our own good wishes for the health and prosperity of our readers as together we seek to follow His Will in our lives.

Are you meditating on His Word everyday? Are you keeping His Commandments and teaching them to your children? Are you stealing from God (failure to tithe)? Are you working on Sundays when God says not to? Are you stealing from your employer (by slacking off, or taking breaks too long, or think you have an entitlement)? Think on these things!

HAVE YOU BEEN OVERCOME BY A SPIRIT OF PESSIMISM?

What is Pessimism? Webster's Ninth New Collegiate Dictionary defines it as "an inclination to emphasize adverse aspects, conditions, and possibilities or to expect the worst possible outcome." What do you have a tendency to emphasize in your life—the positive aspects or the negative ones? Are you always expecting the best to come or the worst?

Bible-believing Christians can have their joy stolen by always having adverse aspects, conditions, and possibilities that they might be facing, over-emphasized to them. Are you one of those victims? Have you allowed your joy to be stolen by yielding to this spiritually unhealthy mindset? Has a "Spirit of Pessimism" gotten a hold on your soul whereby you are always expecting the worst possible outcome in the things that you face from day to day?

Throughout the Scriptures, we find examples where this Spirit of Pessimism was in operation. Let's study them and their causes to see what wisdom we can glean from God's Word today. May our study help to change our attitude and entire perspective on life and cause us once again to see things as God sees them.

1. Focusing On Affliction

"I believed, therefore have I spoken: I was greatly afflicted: I said in my haste, 'All men are liars'" (Psalm 116:1-11).

Here we find David weary, despondent, distressed, and full of despair due to the great, sore, highly-oppressive, and long-lasting afflictions which he was facing. As can happen to the best of men, his passions got the best of him. In his state of fear, confusion and amazement, he spoke rashly and harshly about his friends and all men for that matter. In his bewildered frame of mind, he concluded that, "All men are liars." In other words, all are false, counterfeit, unreliable, deceitful and untrustworthy.

David came to this conclusion because, in his time of need, those who he thought would stand by him, seemed to desert and disown him. Those to whom he showed kindness in the past were nowhere around when he was in need. No one seemed to be there to sympathize or console him in his troubles.

Perhaps, you are feeling the same way today. You find yourself in a state of affliction that seems to be everlasting. You see no end of the tunnel, so to speak. If ever there was a time when you needed your friends to comfort you, it is now. Yet it seems as though all have forsaken and abandoned you to your sorrow and pain. Resultantly, you have developed a negative attitude toward some people or people in general. You promised yourself that you would never trust another or develop a relationship ever again.

But you need to ask yourself the question: Who has told you that "all men are liars" and cannot be trusted or relied on? Was it God or an adversary? Is it really true that none can be trusted—that there are no true friends any more to be found?

2. All is Meaningless

"'Vanity of vanities,' saith the Preacher; 'vanity of vanities; all is vanity'." (Eccl. 1:2)

After searching in all of the wrong places for satisfaction and meaning in life, King Solomon came to the conclusion that "all is vanity"—that life is simply a breath or

vapor that is quickly passing away, leaving no substantial or lasting result behind.

Is this how you feel today? Do you feel as though your life is insignificant? If so, and you are a born-again believer then you have believed a lie for your life has great meaning to all those among whom God sends you.

God has given each one of us a wonderful gift called *influence*. Everywhere we go, we have the power to touch people's lives for His glory and Kingdom.

Don't allow your mind to be flooded with such negative thoughts—saying that life is empty and meaningless. Your life has purpose. God has a unique plan for you to touch the world around you. Seek Him for it, and you will find out what it is!

3. Just a Bunch of Gripping

"But he, himself, went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat under a juniper tree; and he requested for himself that he might die; and said, 'It is enough: now, O LORD. Take away my life; for I am not better than my fathers.' And he came thither into a cave, and lodged there; and, behold, the word of the LORD came to him, and He said unto him, 'What doest thou here, Elijah?'"

And he said, 'I have been very jealous for the LORD God of hosts: for the children of Israel have forsaken Thy Covenant, thrown down Thine altars, and slain Thy prophets with the sword; and I, even I only, am left'" (1Kings 19:4-10).

Here we have a Burnt-Out Prophet who was weary, faint, exhausted, and feeling very alone and overwhelmed with the work. His depressed state of mind caused him to whine, complain and become cross with the people of God. All he could see was all of the good that he had done and all of the stubbornness and obstinacy of the people. No one else was zealous for the Lord like him—at least this is what he supposed.

Everyone else was backslidden on God. He worked hard for the Lord but seemingly to no avail. He had enough of the people's apostasy and rebellion. It was quitting time for him. "It is enough; now, O LORD. Take away my life."

Perhaps you are a minister of the Gospel, and you are feeling very despondent today. You feel as though all of your labor has been in vain. You have become cross with your people because they do not respond to the Truth in the manner that you expect. It seems as though all you can focus on is how much good you have done and how little the people have appreciated it.

Just remember: Elijah's perspective was off. He thought he was the ONLY one serving the Lord. He found out differently that God still had a remnant—besides the Prophet—who loved Him.

Could it be that you lost your joy in the service of the Lord by setting your focus on the wrong things? Don't allow a negative attitude to push you into making a decision that you will some day regret. Take your work before the Lord and allow Him to fill you with His perspective on things.

4. What A Bad Attitude

"And when they returned from searching of the land after forty days. And they went and came to Moses, and to Aaron, and to all the congregation of the children of Israel — and brought back word unto them — and shewed them the fruit of the land. And they told him, and said, 'We came unto the land whither thou sentest us, and surely it floweth



with milk and honey; and this is the fruit of it. Nevertheless the people be strong that dwell in the land, and the cities are walled, and very great: and moreover we saw the children of Anak there — We be not able to go up against the people, for they are stronger than we — The land, through which we have gone to search it, is a land that eateth up the inhabitants thereof; and all the people that we saw in it are men of a great stature. And there we saw the giants —and we were in our own sight as grasshoppers, and so we were in their sight” (Numbers 13:25-33).

This so-called land “that eateth up the inhabitants” and was filled with “giants” happened to be the Lord’s will for His people. This was the land that He promised them from the days of Abraham.

The minds of these ten spies were flooded with negative and discouraging thoughts which kept them from walking into their blessing. Their focus was not on God and His Mighty Power. All they could see were the difficulties and the impossibilities along the way. Consequently, they suffered severely — they lost out with God and never did see the Promised Land. Everyone of those pessimists died a “loser” in the wilderness.

Perhaps God has spoken a Promise to you and your family at this time. Like the Children of Israel, He may have given you a glimpse of what lies ahead. Be very careful how you react to this revelation from the Lord. You can expect complications and troubles along the way, that you will have to undergo. Whatever you do, don’t allow a bad attitude to overtake you. Keep your Faith alive and flourishing by staying in the Word and feeding on God’s “can do” thoughts.

5. I Feared A Fear

“Be careful for nothing ...” (Philippians 4:6).

Some people have been greatly blessed of the Lord, but you would never know it for they can never be at ease in their spirits to enjoy their blessings. They are constantly tormented by a Spirit of Fear — telling them how this or that could happen to steal their blessing.

Are you being robbed of your blessings? Perhaps you cannot even see how God has blessed you and your family because you are always focusing on the troubles. Because you have encountered misfortune in the past, you now have a dread or fear at the slightest wrong coming your way.

God has called you to peace. He wants you to be blessed. He wants you to have joy — “joy unspeakable and full of glory.”

Look around today and count your blessings. You will be amazed at how Good the Lord has been to you and your family. Let holy spirit put a dance in your feet and a shout on your lips. Kick that fear, depression and pessimism out of your house and away from your family.

If in the past, you were one who had the inclinations to “emphasize adverse aspects, conditions, and possibilities or to expect the worst possible outcome,” then, by the grace of God, stop it! Determine from this day forward that you will not be overcome by a spirit of pessimism again.

Enjoy your life. It’s God’s gift to you!

God is not casual in the way He deals with His very own children. He does nothing by chance or happenstance. There is nothing hit-or-miss about His methods. Man may become casual and indifferent toward God, but God cannot be casual towards His people.

Too often, we think of God only as some kind of benign benevolence, a kind elderly, gentle Father who may leisurely get around to meeting our needs. God is seen as a slow-moving problem-solver who must be flagged down. We see Him as some kind of great power that can be energized into action if fed enough faith. In other words, God will act if you make enough noise —loud outcries, intense demonstrations, superhuman efforts to be holy, and if you can get enough others to pray as well (a prayer chain), the more the better!

This kind of thinking suggests man has to first get God’s attention, then plead his pitiful case, then hope this busy Director of the Universe will put him on His list of “favors to be granted.” Meanwhile, the worried Believer hopes he can maintain a sufficient level of faith and good works so as not to lose his place in the blessing line. Wouldn’t it be a shame, we think, to fail the faith test and have to go back to the end of the line? He almost shudders to think his hour of help may arrive and he would not be worthy to receive the answer — as if the Lord were to say to him, “Sorry, I was all ready to answer your prayer and meet your need, but your faith slipped a bit. You got weak; you faltered — so, it will have to wait. Get

back to the Word,; get it right; practice a little longer; get into more patience and when all systems are go, I’ll be back and we’ll see what can be done.”

God forgive us for thinking of Him as a far-off casual Friend who comes to our rescue only in emergencies or when we are about to give up. What a slap in God’s face to suggest that He works on some kind of merit system, as if only the diligent, the strong in faith, the highly disciplined can get His attention. We cannot earn God’s blessings or obtain answers to prayer by claiming a better quality or quantity of faith than our Brother or Sister.

How then, does a Christian get God’s attention? How do we get His ear? (Isaiah 59:1). How can we be assured our need has been placed before Him? How can we know He sees our present troubles? Is He preoccupied with the problems of nations and their leaders? Is He too busy at nature’s master control? Are the world’s problems so complex and mighty, that He has no time for our problems that seem trifling in comparison?

The truth is, none of God’s people have to vie for His attention. We do not have to enroll in some kind of faith inner circle to get better results. We don’t have to weep, or wail, or fast, or groan, or get on a prayer chain to make Him see our present need.

The truth is: God has a heart! He knows our needs, our hurts, our problems, because He know of them before we did! He has been living through them with us. He has always been there from the very first hours the trials hit. He



has been bottling every tear, deeply touched by the feelings of our infirmities.

Wake Him up? Beg for help? Run to Him in panic? Hope He will somehow hear my heart's cry? Try to bring Him down from some cosmic mission to get involved in my need? NO! A thousand times no! Why shout at a Father who is at my side? Why panic when He is closer than a brother? Why worry about a weak or strong faith, when He has already seen and felt my needs?

Did not our Lord say, *"If a man love Me, he will keep My words: and My Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make an abode with him"* (John 14:23)? To add emphasis, He said further, *"... He dwelleth with you, and shall be in you ..."* (John 14:12).

God is not somewhere in the universe, "out there" or "up there"—He is dwelling with us and in us. He is not a casual Lord, who comes and goes according to our moods, doubts and fears. Too often, we think He, somehow "floats away" offended by a temporary fit of temper, weak faith, or fleeting doubts. We hope He will come back when we are improved. How immature and childish these thoughts are. He has promised to never leave us, never forsake us! He is with us in every struggle of life, until the very end. He is faithful to us, even when our faith is staggered and weak.

"If we are faithless, yet He abideth faithful: He cannot deny Himself" (2 Timothy 2:13).

What about all the delays—the unanswered prayers, the lingering illnesses, the never-ending problems, the ever-worsening hurts, the feelings of helplessness? In spite of all the supposedly happy, problem-free saints who claim God has done everything they asked Him, I wonder how soon it will be before they, too, run up against the most severe test of faith in their entire lifetime?

The truth is: God's people are right now going through a spiritual "Great Tribulation." Every Christian's faith is now on trial. This is the final test that will separate the overcomers from the deserters.

Jesus wondered if He would find faith on the earth when He returns. How could that be, when the earth has so many who claim to be His children? The Job-like problems that are being unleashed on Christians today have caused many to wonder if God has quit the prayer-answering business. They say they pray and nothing happens. They need a miracle, because things are turning from bad to worse—but no answer seems to be forthcoming.

It is in this hour of confusion that an awful terror, deep in the soul, begins to surface. An inner haunting grips the mind. "Maybe God expects me to work this problem out all by myself. Maybe God offers us only eternal salvation, but not daily help. Perhaps I've been expecting too much from God. Maybe I am destined to go on hurting, lonely, just getting by. God must be mad at me, because He doesn't seem to see my tears or hear my crying."

So the young lady whose boyfriend breaks her heart gets angry with God. She reasons, "Lord, why did You let him hurt me? Why didn't you keep him loving me? Why do you let me carry this broken heart—until I'm ready to die? Where are You, Lord? How can I serve You if You keep letting me down?"

Listen to parents with the disobedient child: "Dear Lord, when will You ever straighten my child out? Why

won't You come down in answer to my prayer and turn that life around? How many years must go by without a sign of change? Don't my prayers mean anything? Don't the promises work?"

Listen to the child of God in the throes of illness: "Oh God—if You feel our pain, why must I go on suffering? Why are others healed and not me? Why me, Lord? I have claimed every promise in the Bible — my faith has been strong — others have agreed with me in prayer — so why doesn't the miracle happen? Why do I go from bad to worse? Will I ever come out of it? Will you let me die?"

Listen to the troubled marriage spouses: "Father, everything is going wrong—why? I'm in a mess and things are out of control. I am so unhappy. Why can't You lift this burden? I need direction, but I can't seem to get answers. Why won't You lift my loneliness and fear? Why won't You show me what I'm supposed to do? I'll do it, if You will only speak to me. Answer my prayer, please—before it's too late!"

Listen to the fretting believer who is desperately needing a word of direction: "Lord, shall I or shall I not? What is Your Will? What is my next step? I don't want to get out of Your Will, but I don't know what to do next. I'm so confused. Why can't I get clear direction? I'm asking in faith, but I don't seem to get a clear Word from Heaven. What's blocking the answer?"

Oh beloved—we are all going through the same thing! We are all being tested! Every honest child of God knows what it is like to look up to the heavens that seem brass—and wonder if God really hears and answers prayer. When you have done all you can; when you know you believe God is able to do anything; when you pray and weep and hope—and nothing seems to happen—that is when doubt creeps into our thoughts and whispers, "God

will never answer—go ahead and do the best you can. Work it out yourself. Use your head and figure a way out on your own."

I believe in God's interference in man's affairs! Fate is not at the wheel of this universe. Life is not an accidental conglomeration of atoms. God does not reign by accident. The key to understanding God's concern for man is to believe that "He is ever near!" Being near, He is within arm's reach, within ear shot. Being near, He sees me! Faith is seeing the closeness of God.

Through their struggles—their joy—mankind seldom experiences the nearness of God (Deut. 4:7). To the man of faith, God is always nearby, even in the thickest darkness. The trial is never fatal, because the Almighty is at hand. I believe in the livingness of God—rather than Divine casualness. He lives with His children. He walks and talks with them. God will interfere with my affairs, not just to satisfy my prayers, but because it is His nature to do what is right for His children.

I believe in divine sympathy! He acts on my belief because He suffers with me. He enters into my sorrow and, therefore, He is close enough to understand when He must interfere. I don't have to tell Him; He feels it. He knows it even before I ask, because He has been through it all the way with me. I believe in perfect Holy Ghost timing.

I am more interested in God's sympathy than His power. Power has to do with the vast Divineness; sympathy

is His personal concern for my problem. Power is a principle; sympathy is a feeling. He has feelings for me. When I know He feels for me, I know He will act for me. Majesty and power are great principles we attribute to the awesome Father, but it is the pity of His heart toward me that I most respond to. His majesty makes me know He *wants* to. There is nothing casual about that!

God individualizes! He breaks mankind down into nations, to races, to families, to individual persons. We know He is the Redeemer of Israel, but it means little to your needs until you can say, "My Redeemer." I am the apple of His eye! You must personalize God in your hour of need. True, you are but one of His children, yet, you are a co-laborer—you are but one of many. But, not when it comes to your inner dealings with God. When in need, you must see how individual you are how exclusively God sees your needs—how privately He must act on your behalf.

Get your eyes off the universe for a moment; get your eyes on a Friend who never forsakes! Get into His friendliness! Get into His nearness. God desires that we approach Him as if no other person lived on earth, that we alone are the object of His concern. That is not selfishness. Having loved all others, having been charitable and caring, having fulfilled the law of love to a lost world—then move on to the meeting of your needs as if you, alone, existed.

He counts every hair on my head. He bottles every one of my tears. He counts my sighs and my smiles. He is my Redeemer! He interprets for me those things I don't understand in my heart. You must end your loneliness by coming into the nearness of The Anointed! Your problems mount up like unpassable mountains. All around you are no signs of God at work. Doubt assails you from all sides. And, all you have to combat all this are the words pronounced in a book. But, those are the words of a God who rules by voice. He speaks and it happens.

The nearness of God needs to become natural to us. It is not enough to know the truth; we must let that truth become natural to us—a part of us. That comes through meditation (not the sitting on the floor going "...oohhmmmm" type though). God must not be breaking in on us only at intervals, only in flashes of devotion. You never forget what your mind dwells on constantly. Things are riveted to the memory by forcing your thoughts upon it time and again. God's presence, His nearness, can become instinctive to us so that His closeness is engraved in our minds. The heart can become so full of His presence it takes over the mouth.

Job discovered God's faithfulness on an ash heap. He discovered the nearness of God, the personal concern of God, in the crucible of affliction. There are many things that only suffering can teach us. All through the Bible, we see sorrow as the great teacher. There is not much depth to those who go through life without suffering and trial. Such a light theology springs from the lips of those who refuse to yield to the trial of faith. It is the trial—not the reward of faith—that produces fruit.

Suffering and trial brings man face to face with God, with reality. It strips away all false gaiety, all pretentiousness, all empty clichés, all trifling worldliness. It makes a man seek after truth. It was the suffering of Jesus that took away the veil that separated God and man. And, it is human suffering that still removes the scales from eyes blinded to

the promises. It is when the soul is raw and wounded that it yearns the most for a healing balm.

Children have one thing in common—they live only for the present. They want everything "right now." To them, it is now or never. They will put on a tantrum to get what they want immediately. Esau was a child in spirit. He was willing to exchange future blessing to satisfy an immediate hunger. Faith must not become an impetuous demand for God to do what we believe we must have right now! "Now or never, God!" is our childish pout. Immediate gratification, immediate gifts, immediate deliverance—"I can't wait!"

Faith is not a gamble. In other words, "If I get it now, I had faith; if I don't get it now, I didn't have it." Our prayers often seem like taking chances with God. Play the cards right, play the hand properly, and you win the prize. How childish!

Those who are under the tyranny of THE NOW are serving God only with their senses. Mohammed taught that faith is the way to gain happiness of the senses. But, who is the true overcomer, the true person of faith? The one who procures for himself blessings, health, prosperity, a life of personal enjoyment free from suffering? Or, is it the man who has heard that the greatest joys are those of the Spirit—peace, longsuffering, gentleness, patience—the one who no longer lives for the present world? This man of faith is more concerned about *growing* than *getting*.

What has a Christian gained if he learns to obtain everything his heart desires, yet he lays down in old age to die, having never known the fellowship of Jesus' suffering? Once a man touches the invisible with his faith, never again will he be satisfied with the present and the sensual.

Praying through is not praying until one gets his wish granted; rather, it is praying until we are willing to do His will. The holiest prayers are not of petition, but of praise. When petition passes into thanksgiving, Jesus is being revealed. We become elated when God answers, as if that were proof of His grace to us. We become depressed when the prayer goes unanswered, as if our faith has been unsuccessful.

Jesus didn't pray to procure; He prayed to fellowship. He prayed for submission to the Father's will. He prayed that all His wishes would be moderated to the will of His Father, until Obedience was more important than receiving.

How sad we have so few today really interested in pure and simple communion with God. Instead, we come to Him to do battle, to wrestle like Jacob, to demand our rights, to extract blessings, to claim birthrights. "In that day ye shall ask nothing..." We want to force our hearing on the Lord. We pump up our faith like some kind of spiritual adrenalin, and become bloated with it into His presence to exchange it for a shopping cart full of blessings. Faith becomes our green stamps—God becomes the gift center. The more stamps, the more goodies.

How far short that comes in pleasing the heart of our Lord. Demanding faith is not the faith that pleases Him. It is that trusting faith He so desires. Some would rebuke Brother Job if he lived today and said, "Though He slay me, yet will I trust Him." Some, whose theology is all victory and no suffering, would stand in front of the fiery furnace and yell to the Hebrew children, "Oh ye of little faith—you don't have to go through that fire. That fire is of

the devil; claim your rights! Why be singed and suffocated?”

Is prayer only for prizes? Or is prayer meant to make us forget our own wishes and yearn only for Him? Is prayer meant to give us a way out of trouble or to give us the victory in it? “A way of escape that ye may be able to bear it (not escape it).” We don’t ward off evil; we become empowered over it.

No, God is not casual—He is concerned. He is deeply concerned about every detail of our lives. Let us enter into the rest of faith, having confidence that when the time is fully ripe, He will do right by us. The relaxed, unhurried Christian is the believing one. Not a single prayer is blocked out; not once will He fail in our hour of need

Therefore: “Lift up the hands which hang down, and the feeble knees; and make straight paths for your feet, lest that which is lame be turned out of the way: but let it rather be healed” (Hebrews 12:12,13).

So that we may boldly say: “The Lord is my helper, I will not fear what man shall do unto me” (Hebrews 13:6).

GET A SPIRITUAL GRIP

Sometimes life can be so challenging as to be overwhelming. It’s easy to fall into the trap of putting off change, blaming others and blaming God. When that happens, God tells us we need to “get a grip”!

Jesus stated that He came so that people “may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly” (John 10:10). I love this stated purpose of bringing life-giving abundance along with His invitation to “Follow Me” (Matthew 4:19). And I cling to this happily—until life throws a wrench in my gears and I come to a grinding halt. Has anyone ever told you to “get a grip”? I’m sure most of us, at one time or another, have either offered or been offered this blunt advice.

Usually, when that phrase pops up, it means matters aren’t happening the way we thought they would. But a starting point of wisdom is to realize everyone will be confronted with a measure of unexpected challenges not written out in our personal calendars. So here’s a big question to tackle: How much space have we allocated for our Heavenly Father to mold us—even in adversity—into the image of Jesus the Christ? How can we establish spiritual breakthroughs rather than remaining down in the dumps when life throws a curve at us (And it will!) Let’s consider four specific action items that will help us to keep moving forward in response to Jesus’ invitation to “Follow Me.”

1. Don’t Wait—Start Making Good Changes Today

Now is the time, *today* is the day, to start doing whatever must be done to mend your spiritual relationship with God. Think of where you are in life right now. Think for a moment about what you’re reaching for or holding onto—whether it’s self-serving feelings or ageless, divinely oriented values. It may involve your marriage, another family relationship, your job or lack of one. Maybe there’s a situation that seems impossible to resolve—an impregnable barrier before you. Thinking you can’t really deal with it, you put off doing so.

Where I live in California, we say *mañana*—tomorrow. Tomorrow is one of the most hopeful words in the diction-

ary, but it can also be troublesome. There’s a double edge to it. Sometimes it’s better to wake up tomorrow and approach a problem with fresh perspectives that enable wise decisions not based on haste but *patience*. But sometimes you keep going to bed night after night with no results in heart or hand. You never come to a resolution as to how you are going to glorify our Father above, live like Jesus the Christ and be a blessing to other people. What are *you* putting off?

Notice James 4:13-15: “Come now, you who say, ‘Today or tomorrow, we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit.’ Whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away. Instead, you ought to say, ‘If the Lord wills we shall live, and do this or that’.”

Get a grip! Look at the time—it’s ticking away. As the apostle Paul tells us: “Act like people with good sense and not like fools. These are evil times, so make every minute count” (Eph. 5:15-16. Contemporary English Version). None of us can do time over, but we can do it better as we live our lives before God the Father and Jesus the Christ.

2. Stop Blaming Others for Your Problems

Let’s look at a story in 1 Samuel 30 concerning David before he became Israel’s king. We read, “Now it happened, when David and his men came to Ziklag, on the third day, that the Amalekites [longtime enemies] had invaded the South and Ziklag” (verse 1) The account describes how the Amalekites totally laid waste to the city.

This was a devastating blow to David and his companions. Their families had been taken captive. David’s own wives were taken. The tragedy had a terrible effect on the people: “Now David was greatly distressed, for the people spoke of stoning him, because the soul of all the people was grieved” (verse 6). This is a classic case of fault-finding brought on by difficulty. When things aren’t going well, it’s human

nature to lash out and blame others. It’s certainly against our nature to want to take the blame.

Let’s be honest: At one time or another we’ve all had our personal “stoning parties.” Throwing rocks at others, so to speak, is sometimes a way to make us feel better and to not have to bear guilt. Just ask the first man Adam, who effectively blamed God for making his wife Eve, and Eve who in turn pointed to the serpent (Genesis 3:9-13). When will we ever learn that, as an old adage points out, when we point a finger at others there are three fingers pointing back at us?

Of course, you can blame other people all day long, and some people do. Yet, while it’s not easy, owning up to our mistakes and giving our burden over to God and letting go is the only real solution. God isn’t going to simply *take* our frustrations and hurts and self-created problems from us. We have *give* it all over to Him! In order to get a spiritual grip on life, we must move on and give God authority to rule our hearts and lives.

3. Stop Blaming God—Take Responsibility for Your Life

The truth is, *God* can sometimes be the target of our “stoning parties.” After all, He’s in charge, isn’t He? Yet when we blame God, we’re not only assigning fault to Him but are implying that He doesn’t truly care about us. Blam-

ing God is very dangerous spiritually. It ignores God's great care and removes any personal responsibility from ourselves. How convenient!

Until we look at ourselves and recognize our corrupt nature as defiant of God, bent on blaming Him rather than ourselves, and until we take responsibility for our lives, God cannot actively work in us to help us as He wants to.

Let's notice something from the story of Job, where things were not going as planned. Life became unbearable as one calamity after another struck. "Then his wife said to him, 'Do you still hold fast to your integrity? Curse God and die!'" (Job 2:9). This was blurted out in desperation, but it seems that Job's wife placed blame on him and God.

Job was a man who worked to overcome corrupt human nature, however. He said to his wife: "You speak as one of the foolish women speaks. Shall we indeed accept good from God, and shall we not accept adversity?" (vs 10). [note that Job attributed adversity to God and not to some supernatural devil!]

This is a powerful example for us. If we're going to get a spiritual grip, we must look ourselves square in the face and recognize that we need to examine ourselves first and not last. Don't blame others. Don't blame God. The English poet Robert Browning summed it up this way: "When the fight begins with himself, a man's worth something."

4. Cast Your Cares Upon God, For He Cares For You

Perhaps at times you feel God has gone tone-deaf to your prayers. That's why it's important to persist in seeking Him in prayer. Once you begin reaching for God and ask for His sustaining grace to be involved in your life, God does hear.

Allow God to create a new story—His story as personified by the Son of Man, Jesus the Christ—in you by "humbling yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time, casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you" (1 Peter 5:6-7). "But," you might reply, "You don't realize the mess I've created for myself and others!"

Let's stop right here! Sometimes we feel that we have to be perfect before approaching God. Just ask Samson, who cried out to God in a tight squeeze, or ask the thief on Golgotha, who spoke to Jesus and received a blessing. Consider David's repentance before God in Psalm 51 after being confronted with his terrible sins. Perfection isn't a prerequisite for asking God to give you the rope to hold onto Him. God is there during all the trials and seasons of life.

Psalm 23, also written by David, addresses these varied seasons of life. It's not just soothing words—it's life! Notice the anchoring statement in verse 1. This verse starts with a masterful Shepherd in whom we "shall not want"—shall not lack—depicting His perfect ability to personally minister to our needs.

It takes us through the green pastures—the good times. It takes us through the still waters—the peaceful times. But it also takes us through the valley of the shadow of death—the dark and troubling times. Yet at the very end, it echoes what we're talking about right now.

David wrote, "surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life" (verse 6). He maintained faithful trust and kept a "knowing grip" on the eternal lifeline even in the hardest of times.

Your Creator knows exactly where you are at this moment, and He knows what you need. In yet another Psalm of David, Psalm 18, he wrote: "It is God who arms me with strength, and makes my way perfect. He makes my feet like the feet of [a] deer" (verses 32-33). "Deer" is a translation that doesn't capture the sense of David's understanding. The imagery describes the stunning grip of a mountain goat or bighorn sheep on a high crag, standing on a narrow, precarious ledge but never falling.

The psalm continues: "He sets me on my high places. He teaches my hands to make war" (vs 33-34). God gives us the ability to be champions within His faith and succeed in the hardest of times. His love and care are what enable us to "get a spiritual grip" on life and make it work.

"You have also given me the shield of Your salvation: Your right hand has held me up; your gentleness has made me great" (verse 35). God sincerely desires for you to have an abundant relationship-oriented existence with Him forever. He has earnestly extended His hand to you to help you get a grip on what He's offering beyond our moments of frustration.

Today, right now, God has not chosen to create new conditions for us to live in. When we wake up tomorrow morning, the world will be much the same as it is today. But God is creating new people today through His Spirit. These are men and women who by God's sustaining grace embrace the realization expressed by author Victor Fankl, that "you cannot control what happens to you in life, but

you can always control what you will feel and do about what happens to you" (*Man's Search for Meaning*, 1946). And, may I add, you are not alone in facing whatever happens!

The priceless invitation of Jesus the Christ to "Follow Me" remains as we follow not only His footsteps, but also His "heart steps," as we declare in thought, word and deed, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit" (Luke 23:46).

WHAT IS THE BIBLE

ALL ABOUT?

The Story of Two Brothers...

There was a time that almost every family has at least one *Bible* in their home. Many times it just laid there gathering dust and was hardly ever opened. Many felt that they were getting The Word by attending church and *Bible* school every Sunday. Regardless of the many errors contained therein, I still use the KJV that is 1,600 pages long.

If you were seen reading *The Bible* and someone were to ask you what *The Bible* is all about, how would you answer them? After reading and studying The Bible for over thirty years I would give them the following book review:

In Genesis 12:3 God called Abram to bring about the plans He had in mind for us, laid down from the foundation of the world. From this point on to the end of Revelation The Bible becomes a **Story of One Man's Family**: Abraham and his children. There is a reason Abraham is mentioned 66 times in the New Testament.

God has always had a people . . . the same people He had from the beginning, as He never had to go to any other people on earth to follow Him and fulfill His plan for the



ages. God did not make a mistake but will bring His plans to pass

Every writer of *The Bible* was an Israelite and it was addressed only to Israel. I feel that it is important to mention Deuteronomy 4:8:

And what nation is there so great, that hath statutes and judgments so righteous as all this law, which I set before you this day?

This is one of the greatest gifts He gave us — the same gift that thousands of today's preachers attack with fervor as they prefer *man's* laws.

His Laws should never be looked down upon as a curse or burden to us. There are dozens of things I would like to mention in this paragraph, but we'll go on to the next subject . . .

The Bible is also a **Tale of Two Cities** that runs from Genesis to Revelation: ancient Babylon and the old city of Jerusalem. In the New Testament they are called Mystery Babylon and the New Jerusalem.

Mystery Babylon is not a city or a geographical spot on the globe, but a political, economic and religious system that controls the world, also referred to as the Beast System.

In 1 Chron. 17:9 Nathan told David, while standing in Jerusalem: *"Also I will ordain a place for My people Israel, and will plant them, and they shall dwell in their place, and shall move no more; neither shall the children of wickedness waste them any more, as at the beginning."*

This was important enough to be repeated in 2 Samuel 7:10. The Old Jerusalem is out of the picture now as Jesus said it will be as Shiloh, where His spirit would no longer dwell.

No preachers like to mention or comment on these two verses as it would prove their eschatology a lie. It appears that America was the last place that we moved to and our early Americans referred to this land as the New Israel.

When reading the prophets, it describes this land as well as the people that are repeating the same things our ancestors did. These were not ignorant people. Thomas Jefferson re-counting the life of George Washington wrote a letter to a Dr. Walter Jones and ended his letter with: *I felt on his death, with my fellow countrymen, that a great man hath fallen today in Israel.*

The pastors today have done a great job of hiding things in plain sight. There is much more that I could add to this, but I'll go on to another part of this review . . .

The Bible is also a **Story of Two Brothers** that runs from Genesis to Revelation. The brothers, of course, are Jacob and Esau. It's the story of the primal birthright where Esau is doing everything he can today to get it back.

At this point in time Jacob-Israel is in bondage and under the control of Esau-Edom, trying to bring in their counterfeit kingdom, called the New World Order. The good news is that they will fail.

It is amazing how so many of today's pastors cannot identify the descendants of Jacob-Israel or Esau-Edom. These two brothers have played a tremendous role in what has happened to us over the last one hundred years. Again there is much more to be added to this also . . .

There is also a **National Message to Israel** that runs through the entire Bible that is never to be mentioned in our pulpits today, as everything is directed at the individual.

That brings us to the **Doctrine of Redemption**. If you check your Bible, the term redeem, redeemed and redemption, always refers to Israel. It is not a synonym for salvation. We have not been redeemed yet, as it is still in the future. We are now under the debt bondage of the cursed usury system, but He says:

"We will be redeemed without silver or gold,"

Which means those debts will all be cancelled by Him. At the end of the age we are to

"Look up, for our redemption draweth nigh." This has not happened, we have not been redeemed yet.

Last, but by no means least . . . it is the story of God's Anointed from the time of Moses to the end of the Bible, and His plan for our salvation, that is manifested throughout The Word. As Matthew said in 1:21, **He shall save His people from their sins**. As you can see, this does not seem to be a Universal statement. I will not spend time on this as it has been exploited behind over 100,000 pulpits almost every Sunday, along with TV and radio stations from coast to coast. Some of these ministries have made millions by just concentrating on it.

It has gotten to the point that many feel that the only reason we have The Bible is for our salvation . . . as they now feel that there is no responsibility on their part for the rapid decline of our once-great Christian nation, and that they are no longer the salt of the earth as the Christians of just a few hundred years ago were. Many there are that feel that I'm saved, and I'm going to heaven and that's all I need to know.

It's no wonder our nation that has adopted and follows the new beliefs of Judeo-Christianity is on a fast track to hell in the last hundred years.

In short, The Bible is the story of One Man's Family. . . A Tale of Two Cities . . . The Age-long Battle for the Primal Birthright Between Two Brothers . . . and Jesus' plan of both Redemption . . . and Salvation for Abraham's children.

Everything else in *The Bible* touches on one or more of these things I have listed, with the exception of the personal issues addressed to us, especially in the New Testament.

The Bible contains all the answers as to why we are no longer under God's blessings as we once were, when we followed His absolutes.

I can see a **Plot that Runs Through the Entire Bible**, but intentionally concealed by our shepherds to make it appear that *The Bible* is lacking a consistent theme.

If anyone feels he can come up with a better answer to the question **WHAT IS THE BIBLE ALL ABOUT?** and feels he can explain it better in two pages, contact the one who gave this to you.
